Gentlemen:

The Washington State Board of Registration for Architects met last week and confirmed the cooperative program for reciprocal licensing between the states of Oregon, California and Washington. We feel sure that this will be a service to the profession in its practice up and down the coast and further, will ease the burden on the several boards in the holding of examinations.

The Washington Board had its first opportunity to interview applicants from Oregon and California at its last meeting. All the applicants were considered favorably, but were asked to at least have applied for a N.C.A.R.B. record. We do not believe that it was the intent of the boards to bypass the N.C.A.R.B. entirely, but to provide relief from the excessive delay experienced. In many cases the applicant does not apply for a N.C.A.R.B. record until he is under the pressure of a commission. The Washington State law requires the out-of-state registrant to present evidence of passing an examination equivalent to N.C.A.R.B.

With this in mind, we feel that it is to the Board's advantage and to the future advantage of the applicant to ask that he have an application currently on file with N.C.A.R.B. All the applicants reviewed either had applications on file or were glad to apply.

If the N.C.A.R.B. is to function in the manner as outlined in 1961, it will need the support of the entire profession.

Please let us know of your reaction to this procedure as it relates to N.C.A.R.B., as it would be well if we developed common procedures for review of applicants.


Dear Stacey:

We are completing inquiries now for the file for Mr. Arnold G. Gangnes and at the same time we would like to have you look over the NCARB Grade Report which you submitted to us for him in order that necessary corrections may be made before the time that we are ready to issue the Certificate. Please review this as soon as possible since we are completing his file rapidly and believe that we will be able to go ahead with issuance of the Certificate without the customary green cover application to your Board of the basis of procedures approved at the last Convention.

We are enclosing the grade report which you submitted for Mr. Gangnes and would like to call to your attention that apparently the site plan grade should be recorded under "K" for architectural composition since this particular phase of examination dealt with site planning at that time. We are concerned about the lack of a grade in examination "H" which is supervision and if this was covered under other sections we believe it will be best to distribute those grades so that a grade is shown for the supervision phase. NCARB did maintain a syllabus at one time which did not include the miscellaneous section "I" but all other sections were included in the syllabus and should be covered by the grade report.

We are enclosing for your files one print of each of the NCARB Examination Report and the Certificate Form for the above referenced architect. The Council approval is indicated by the signature of the Council Secretary on the date shown and the application has been issued NCARB Certificate Number 4477.

In accordance with long established procedures, the applicant has been advised that since his NCARB Certificate is based on examinations in your State, one of the Council requirements for maintaining that NCARB Certificate in force is that he must maintain his state registration with your Board in good standing. For this reason, it is requested that you inform the Council Offices if for any reason your Board should ever find reason to take action toward revoking or suspending the State registration of this architect.

In accordance with a resolution adopted by the Council at the Philadelphia Convention on April 24, 1961, the NCARB By-Laws now provide that Council Certification shall be in effect for a period of one year. Subsequent use of the Certificate shall be predicated on the submission of an annual fee and the submission of an annual affidavit. The first annual renewal fees and annual affidavits for Certificate holders were due on January 1, 1962. The By-Laws also now provide that the Council shall prepare and distribute annually to its member Boards a list containing the names of all Certificate holders who have submitted the required annual affidavit and have paid their annual renewal fees. In this manner you will be kept informed of this architect's status with the Council and at your request we could supply you with information on his continued professional experience at any time from the information on his annual affidavits.

As this architect uses his NCARB Certificate for applications for reciprocal registration in other states, it will at times be necessary that we contact you for a current Certificate of his standing with your Board. We will make such a request only when his file does not contain a previously issued Certificate of Standing from your State that will present to the Board to which he makes application a sufficiently current statement of his standing with your Board.

The cooperation of your Board resulting in the issuance of this NCARB Certificate has been sincerely appreciated.


