Arch N. Torbitt, 75, retired Seattle architect, died yesterday at his home, 1807 N. 51st St., after a long illness.

Mr. Torbitt formerly was associated with George Wellington Stoddard, architect, here many years. He also worked in Juneau for the Alaska Public Works Administration.
