Items from Historic Home on Display at Historical Museum

On Thursday, October 8, 2015 Lewis County residents will have the opportunity to take a glimpse inside of a 1925 Chehalis farmhouse. On that evening, the Lewis County Historical Museum in partnership with the Port of Chehalis will be displaying pieces from an historic farmhouse located on 1663 Bishop Rd that is currently being salvaged. That Thursday, the museum will be open extended hours from 10 AM to 7 PM to allow people to view salvaged pieces of the home. The museum is participating in the salvage efforts in order to preserve this unique piece of Chehalis's history.

As we would like all Lewis County citizens to experience their history and learn about their heritage, Museum admission for October 8th will be free of charge by a sponsorship from the Port of Chehalis.

"There are many farmhouses unique to Lewis County that are an important part of our history," says museum director Andy Skinner. "We want people to have the opportunity to see the pieces, which is why we're open extended hours on Thursday - so people can stop in after they get off work to see it."
