POWER UNIT BEING BUILT

Longview Sub-Station to Be Second of Kind in Northwest.

LONGVIEW, Wash., Sept. 5.— (Special.)—An automatically operated sub-station, costing approximately \$50,000 and said to be the second of its kind in the northwest, is under construction here by the Longview Public Service company. It will supply power and light for Longview proper, getting its energy from the Long-Bell power plant. The only other station of similar type in the northwest is in Seattle, according to M. C. Allen, superintendent of electrical construction for the local company.

The building, designed by A. N. Torbitt, architect, of this city, will be of reinforced concrete, will have ground dimensions of 50x50 feet and a height of 32½ feet. The equipment will include transformers, automatic switches and metering equipment of the latest design, requiring no manual operations whatever and guaranteeing continuous service.
