ST. LUKE'S ENGAGES ARCHITECT RIGG

Spokane Man Is to Prepare Plans for New Hospital Building.

RUSH PLAN FOR FUNDS

Banker Is Invited to Head Board— 'Care' for Student Nurses.

Archibald Rigg has been selected as the architect to design the new St. Luke hospital that will rise on the site of the old building, burned a week ago last night. The new structure will cost approximately \$300,000 and will be so designed that it can be one unit of a larger hospital.

Plans for the raising of the \$300,000 are expected to take form this week at daily luncheons of the board of trustees at Davenport's.

Mr. Rigg is already directing the construction of the roof over the old structure, which is expected to be ready for temporary occupancy by about 40 patients inside of 10 days.

The task of raising funds is in the hands of a committee consisting of Bishop Herman Page, Frank T. McCollough and E. H. Knight. All plans for this work are held in abeyance, however, until a head for the financial committee can be found. In place of R. L. Rutter, president of the Spokane and Eastern Trust company, who declined to take the position because pressure of business affairs made it impossible to give the necessary time,
