












### New Ferry County Courthouse Opens










#### Map Showing location of Interpretive Center to Fort Okanogan sites.



#### The Fort Okanogan Historical Museum

The Washington State Parks and Recreation Commission acquired land at the Fort Okanagan site in 1951. The first archeological work began of the rost Oxanogan site in 1951, the hirst archeological work begun in 1952, with the Commission coperating with the National Park Service. The museum tells the story of the fur trade, the region, and the Columbia and Okanogan rivers on which the trading posts were located.
























- Due notice will be given of the actual date of ground-breaking for the new building. All members should rally around the steam shovel that day.




