



ARCHITECTS COMPLETE ARMORY PLANS


Plans Provide for Magnificent Structure to Be Built of Brick, Concrete or Chuckanut Stone—Cost Will Be Approximately \$75,000—Armory Commission Desires That Local Material Be Used in Construction—Bids Called for On Three Kinds of Material.

ARCHITECTURE TO BE OF OLD CASTLE STYLE

First Photograph of Plans for New Structure Published Today—Work to Be Started Next Month and Will Be Completed by September 1.

The plans for the Bellingham armory, which is to be constructed during the coming summer under an appropriation made by the state legislature of 1909, have been completed by Blackwell & Halsey, a firm of Seattle architects, which secured the contract, and bids have been called for

A photograph of the proposed Bellingham armory, to be built at the corner of Pine and 3 1/2 streets, at an approximate cost of \$75,000, is published in The Herald for the first time. There will be a slight variation from the drawing in the amended plan, however. The roof, instead of coming to a point, or an angle at the peak, will be oval or arc-shaped. The castle style of architecture will prevail, as indicated in this picture.
