Architect's Offices Opened by Veteran

Lawrence G. Evanoff, a 1947 graduate of the University of Washington, has opened architectural offices on the fifth floor of the American Legion building, he said today.

The new architect, a graduate of Spokane schools, is the son of Mr. and Mrs. King Evanoff, E1712 Thirteenth.

A veteran, he served in the South Pacific during the war. Evanoff saw service with the infantry and field artillery and became a photo technician in the air force during the latter part of his enlistment.

The young man was one of the two young Spokane architects chosen to take over the duties last year of Professor T. J. Prichard, head of art and architecture at the University of Idaho. Royal McClure of the firm of McClure & Adkison was the other architect. They taught all architectural courses at the university for a year.

Like many new architects, Evanoff is "seriously concerned with contemporary modern architecture." He believes today's architect should refrain from copying the classical forms and design structures which are suitable for present-day needs.

Evanoff and his wife, the former Lois Green of Edwall, live in Dishman.
