BUILDING WILL GROW

Electricians Told That More Homes Will Arise Here Soon.

Because prices of material and labor are lower than they have been since the close of the war, and because of shortage of homes, Bellingham will see more building in 1922 than for some years. This is the opinion expressed last night by Architect **T. F. Doan** in an address before the Electrical Development league of Whatcom county. Mr. Doan said that an increase in home building is bound to come this year.

Robert Gray, of the Modern Electrical company, talked on "The Importance of Proper Electrification." Defining this term, he said that it meant good workmanship and standard materials at a fair price. Other speakers were H. B. Sewall, manager of the Puget Sound Power and Light company, who discussed co-operation between architects and electrical contractors, and R. G. Emerson, field secretary of the Northwest Electrical Service league, who spoke on "Finishing Touches," these dealing with wiring and other finishing work in modern buildings. President A. S. Clark of the local league made the introductions and W. I. Carter was toastmaster.
