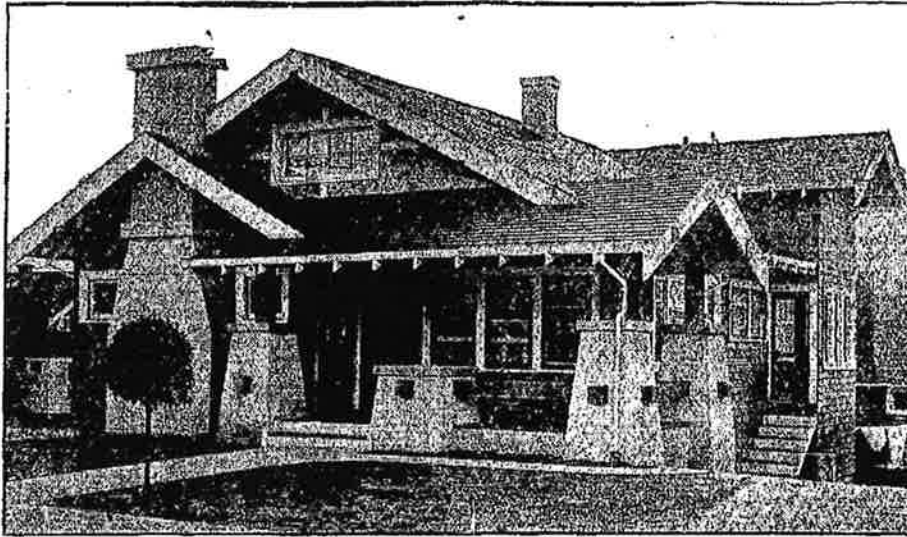


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BUNGALOW HOME HAS FIVE LARGE ROOMS

Contestant in Los Angeles "Own Your Home" Contest Points Out Many Logical Arguments.

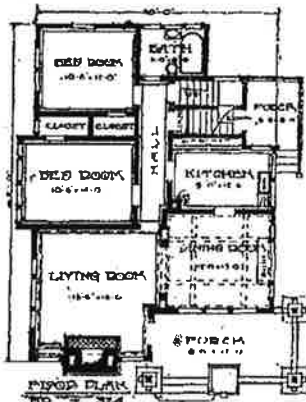

Here is one of the prize-winning letters submitted by Miss Jennie Van Allen, who prepared her letter under the title, "Twenty Reasons Why I should Own My Own Home." Miss Van Allen's reasons are both sentimental and practical, and it was the committee's judgment that they were clearly and sincerely expressed. Her letter follows:

"Because it is in my blood. For generations we have been land owners because we believed the safest investment was the earth that held the world together.
