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BUNGALOW ON MANSFIELD

J. C. HOLMES STARTS WORK ON \$5000 RESIDENCE.

**Contains Six Rooms—Rustic Founda-
tion With Half Timber Work
Above Window Sills.**

J. C. Holmes has begun the building of a six-room bungalow at the north-west corner of Mansfield avenue and Post street, which will cost about \$5000. The foundation of the house is rustic rock five feet above the grade, and the walls to the height of the window sills are rough eight inch siding stained dark brown. From the window sills to the roof the exterior is half timber work. The eaves are four feet wide and the roof is stained dark red. Two exposed chimneys of red granite brick add an attractive feature to the house.

Across the front of the house is a wide porch covered by an extension of the main roof, which is supported by heavy square columns 20x20 inches. The outside dimensions are 31x43 feet.

The entrance to the house is in the middle of the front. A vestibule opens on the right into the living room, and on the left into the dining room and library. The living room is 20x20 with beamed ceiling, large fireplace and paneled wainscot of curly fir four feet high. In the library there is a built-in bookcase and the dining room is equipped with a built-in slideboard. Both of these rooms have paneled wainscot, above which the walls are burlap. Besides these rooms there are two chambers, the kitchen and bathroom. The house will have an attic unfinished and full basement with furnace heat. Alfred Jones is the architect.

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
