Double Residence Overlooking Lake



A double residence for Mrs. Kate A. Fabj, which was completed in December from plans prepared by Architect James E. Blackwell at a cost of \$7,000. The property is on Thirty-first Avenue, south of Alder Street, overlooking Lake Washington. Advantage was taken of this fact by having wide porches on the east end, with large living rooms opening onto porches through French windows. The floors are oiled, the dining rooms are wainscoted and have beamed ceilings. The building has slash-grained fir finish throughout, brick mantels and hot water heat. The Mission treatment has a soft dark brown stain on rough siding for body of walls and ivory painted trimmings. The blue clicker brick for front porches, steps and posts also add to the old Mission effects.
