Fred Stephen, architect 40 years, dies

Memorial services for Fred B. Stephen, 89, a retired architect and Seattle pioneer, will be held at 2 p. m. Saturday in the Ploeger Mortuary chapel.

Mr. Stephen died in a nursing home Wednesday. A native of Chicago, he came to Seattle in 1890. He was a University of Pennsylvania graduate. He practiced architecture here about 40 years before his retirement in 1960.

As a younger man, he was associated with his father, James Stephen, designer of Queen Anne High School.

Mr. Stephen was a Mason and member of the Scottish Rite, Columbia Congregational Church, the Columbia Pioneers and the American Institute of Architecture. He lived many years in the Seward Park area.

Survivors are two brothers, Walter M. Stephen, Seattle, and J. Howard Stephen, Peshastin, Cheilan County.
