

JONES OF SPOKANE DEAD IN SAN DIEGO

Well Known Architect Dies After Vain Attempt to Regain Health.

Alfred Jones, for many years a resident of Spokane, a well-known architect with offices in the Mohawk building, died yesterday afternoon at San Diego, Cal., according to word received last night by relatives here.

Mr. Jones was acquainted widely throughout Spokane and surrounding country, especially among the architects and builders. He came to Spokane about 16 years ago and had built up a large business, when, on account of his falling health, he was compelled to give up active work. Having travelled all over the world in an effort to regain his health, he located in San Diego a little over a year ago. Among the various buildings erected in this city by Mr. Jones, the building now occupied by the Kemp & Hobert department store was among the last.

Mr. Jones was 42 years of age at the time of his death. He is survived by his wife, two sons, Alfred and Harold, a brother, Fred Jones, residing at E415 Baldwin avenue, and a sister, Mrs. Jane Hart, in Chicago. Funeral arrangements have not been announced, but in all probability the body will be brought to Spokane.
