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Specifications, etc. Protect the owner against loss and damage, providing for adjustment of all matters liable to dispute, a technical description of all work, stipulating the manner in which it shall be done, the materials used, etc., and covering every point not embraced in the drawings; also a blank form of "Builder's Contract and Bond" ready for execution, and a recommendation of a scheme of color for painting the house, if requested.

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This is a matter easily accomplished by the builder. It is the universal custom all over the country for a builder to erect a house reversed from the plans as shown, if so desired, and all he needs to do, if he wishes to see them reversed, is to hold them to the light, and looking through them from the back side, he will see them so. Printed so if desired.

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Bills of material we do not furnish, as no two crews of men will use the same amount of material, some being wasteful and others economical, and the estimator is blamed for the discrepancy.

BUILDING COSTS CHANGE

It must always be borne in mind that the cost of any building in any locality, will depend upon the conditions of the building trade at the time construction is ordered and that these conditions are constantly changing.

COMPETITIVE BIDS

A reliable and actual cost can only be learned by getting two or more responsible contractors to furnish signed bids, made on the complete working drawings, details and specifications. At the best, these bids will generally vary from 5 per cent. to as high as 25 per cent. The low man's figure, if he be reliable, represents the real cost.

EXCHANGE OFFER:—After you have ordered plans and find the bids you obtain run greater than the amount you wish to expend, the plans may be returned if in good order, within 30 days, and you will be entitled to the selection of any other lower cost design. This offer will protect you on the "cost question."

A rough diagram or description of your own ideas should accompany the sketch order. This sketch offer is for the purpose of showing what can be accomplished in original design and is preparatory to the placing of an order for the completion of full working drawings, details and specifications. Commissions for sketches are therefore not solicited, excepting where the intention of a prospective builder is, upon sketch being satisfactory, to order the full working drawings.

SPECIAL PLANS:—The above sketch offer is preparatory to an order for special plans and the cost of such will be quoted on request. It will, of course, be dependent upon the size of the house, character of the design and the work which would be involved in making the plans. The fact that houses built from carefully prepared studies and plans sell advantageously when built is an important matter not to be overlooked should you ever wish to dispose of your property.

CALIFORNIA BUNGALOW. DESIGN NO. D-1080

This attractive little bungalow home most certainly expresses refinement and good taste. There are certain little touches such as the long triple window, with its diamond side lights and flower box, in the living room, the irregularly laid brick in the chimney and porch column and the unbroken slope of the roof that give it an attractive individuality. As a whole it has, with its wide undressed siding stained a rich brown and cream painted trimming, a dignified and simple homelike appearance that is charming.

While only consisting of three rooms and bath, it has all the really necessary requirements of a small family,


While only consisting of three rooms and bath, it has all the really necessary requirements of a small family, and if at any time more room should be required, it would be an easy matter to build on a room or two at the rear. The large size of the front room permits its use as both living room and dining room, but if this were deemed unsatisfactory an extension could be built at the rear for a kitchen and the present kitchen connecting through a large opening with the living room would make a very pleasant dining room.

If one or two additional attic bedrooms were required the pitch of the roof and the height of the plate could be slightly increased to get sufficient head-room, and the stairway built in part of the space occupied by the three closets. This would require building the cottage two feet deeper.

The large bedroom opens directly on the porch, an arrangement particularly desirable when located near enough to the water to dress for bathing in the house.

If more porch room were desired, the present one could be continued around the side of the house and given a pergola treatment that could be either sheathed over solid and canvased, or left open and vines trained to grow over the rough brick columns and up over the open rafters.

No cellar is provided



but where one is desired and the house kept as low as shown, it could be ventilated through windows opening on little areaways. If this were not considered advisable the floor level could be raised about eighteen inches to allow for the windows above grade. This, of course, would affect the appearance of the house.






SUBURBAN COTTAGE. DESIGN No. D-1301

This example of a concrete and shingled two-story cottage has been selected as having many attractive and practical features such as the extremely simple roof-line and porch treatment, the compact arrangement of rooms, suggested to produce this exterior effect, and the simple window treatment.

It would indeed be difficult to design a two-story cottage home more attractive in its appearance. The living room and hall are practically one room, and if this effect were further desired the opening could be extended back to the dining room partition. Not an inch of waste space can be discovered in this plan, and the rooms are so arranged that not a foot of waste material would be necessary in construction. A small basement is provided under this house. The cost of this design would be \$1,575, exclusive of the heating, plumbing, and electric work. Price of plans and specifications, \$15.00.









STUCCO BUNGALOW. DESIGN No. D-1302

As an example of a cement or concrete covered bungalow this design has been selected as meeting the requirements of many. The exterior is enhanced by the outside chimney worked into the end of the living room, which extends entirely across the front of the house, according to the plan herewith suggested. Opening from this living room through a wide archway is a very attractive dining room, connecting with the kitchen in turn through a roomy pantry. Two very nice bedrooms, with bathroom are provided on the ground floor, and the plans suggested show how four additional rooms could be secured on the second floor. This second floor could be finished, or not, as desired; if not, a door at the foot of the stairs would keep out the cold of the unused attic story. Cost with basement, but not including heating, plumbing, electric work, or the finishing of the second story, \$1,575. Plans and specifications, \$15.00.







BUNGALOW. DESIGN NO. D-1303


This delightful little bungalow design has been selected as one of the best examples of a model, thoroughly up-to-date, practical cottage home. The above illustration was taken shortly after completion and needs attractive planting of shrubbery about the base, with flowering vines growing over the lattice on the side.

The exterior treatment follows the simple and beautiful lines of the Swiss Chalet in, of course, a very much modified and simplified form. The particular merits of the design seem to be the extreme economy of construction, for it will be noticed that the roof is not shingled but covered with a simple patent roofing, used with battens softening the roof lines and giving a very clean cut appearance, while the barge boards are simple in the extreme. In other words the whole effect is secured by a simplicity of treatment. The house rests on a brick foundation and this may be a concrete wall below grade and should be if good clean concrete sand can be secured out of the excavation for the cellar. The house walls are covered with cypress siding. The compactness of the design makes it desirable to provide a full basement under the entire house, excepting the porch.

The floor plan arrangement suggested herewith appears to one as extremely practical and including all of the conveniences of a much larger and more expensive home. One attractive feature is the combination side entrance which leads to either kitchen or basement and does away with the troublesome cellar hatchway, that is, a descent of four steps from the kitchen floor is made to a platform one step above grade level and on which the kitchen door opens, where from the stair descends to the base-The living room is attractive with its corner fireplace just opposite the entrance door, and so located that its flue and that of the kitchen range use the same chimney. A door at the rear of the living room alongside the fireplace opens on a centre hall, upon which open the two bedrooms and a bath. A good sized closet is provided at the end of the hall; this could be used for linen, or, as it is convenient to the front door, as a coat closet. The floor of the closet in the right hand bedroom is slightly raised so as to give sufficient headroom to the cellar stairs going down beneath. The dining room has windows on three sides and should make a very pleasant and attractive room.

The cost of building this little design, according to the floor plans here suggested, would in the average locality cost about \$750 without basement, which would further increase the cost about \$250, and exclusive of the heating, plumbing and electric work.


TWO STORY COTTAGE. DESIGN NO. D-1304


This cottage has been selected as a model type of a compact two-story cottage home. Instead of projecting the porch at the side, which for many building sites would be impractical, it would seem to be a better arrangement to run the porch straight across the front. This would make it appear as more of a house and give a very delightful porch. It will be noted that the floor plan is almost square, requiring the minimum amount of material to construct. The living room, extending clear across the front of the house is unusually attractive and the bedrooms on the second floor are of very good size.

While the plans have been drawn for the porch treatment across the front, the side porch can, of course, be used, if that be preferred. This alternative has been provided for in the plans. Cost of this design with basement under the entire house is estimated at \$1,500, exclusive of the heating, plumbing, and electric work.






SEMI-BUNGALOW. DESIGN NO. D-1305

As a departure from the strictly bungalow type and yet keeping away from the two-story effect, this design has been selected as embodying many attractive and delightful features, chief among which, as to the exterior, are the deep shadows cast by the wide projecting cornice and the bold sweep of the roof toward the front, surmounted by the very attractive front dormer. The porch is unusually spacious and attractive and will make a delightful feature of this home.

In the interior the large living room is embellished by an inglenook, and in connection with the dining room, from which is projected a bay window, we have an interior that will delight every real home lover. The sloping roof necessarily limits somewhat the size of the rooms on the second floor. Nevertheless, they could be somewhat enlarged if one would be content with a little less head room along the side walls where the roof rafters keep approaching the floor. The rooms as designed show a minimum height here of about 5 feet. This design is intended to have a full basement under the main part of the house and the estimated cost is \$1,525, exclusive of the heating apparatus, plumbing, and electric work. 


SEMI-BUNGALOW DESIGN. NO. D-1306

A semi-bungalow and selected because it suggests how, by combining two harmonizing materials, low cost and attractive effects can be had for a small cottage. The house is absolutely simple. The brick work, capped with a course of headers under the sill line and in pleasing contrast with the stucco above, is practically its only ornamentation.

The floor plan suggested for this elevation shows a very pleasing arrangement of rooms. The living room, dining room and hall are of ample size and with the large connecting archways, open up into practically one large room. The pantry is unusually well provided with dresser space for a house of this size. Four steps to a door on the main stair landing provide convenient passage from the pantry to the front door and the three second story bedrooms. There is a full basement under the entire house.

The estimate cost of this semi-bungalow is \$1,525, exclusive of the heating, plumbing, electric work and decorations. Price of plans and specifications, \$15.





SUBURBAN COTTAGE DESIGN. NO. D-1307


This two-story cottage has been selected as one adaptable to almost any suburban location. The front gable gives it a certain uplifting effect which would permit of its location between much larger houses

without looking dwarfed.

The living room of the proposed floor plan occupies the full front of the house. A fire place is built in the end of the room, but if one wanted to economize, it could be located on the right-hand side of the stairway. This would allow the kitchen range and fireplace to use the same chimney. The dining room is of good proportions and has a little flower bay with casement windows built in the side wall. It connects with the kitchen through a butler's pantry. Off the kitchen is a small latticed porch which when over-grown with climbing roses or honeysuckle would make an attractive corner of the house. There are four bedrooms and a bath on the second floor with closets built under the slope of the roof.

The estimate cost with cellar is \$1,600, exclusive of the heating, plumbing, electric work, and decorations.




TWO-STORY COTTAGE DESIGN. NO. D-1308

This attractive little cottage home has been classed as a type particularly adapted to economical home construction. The exterior with its simple window treatment and the combination of shingles and stucco has a pleasing and homelike appearance. If one wanted more porch room, it would be a simple matter to carry the present entrance porch across the front. In this case, the entrance porch roof could be left as it is, leaving the rest as terrace, or the whole could be covered and the roof hipped as that over the sun room.

In the floor plan suggested, the living room carries across the entire front of the house. It connects with the dining room through a wide opening and with the sun-room through a pair of glass doors. Between the dining room and kitchen is a pantry, with dresser having counter shelf with drawers and cupboards below. On coming into the kitchen from the outside, one passes through an entry with a place for the ice-box. There is also a passage leading to the living room and convenient for answering the front door. From this passage descends the combined outside and kitchen cellarway. There are three bed-rooms on the second floor. The front or owner's room is especially large and with its closet takes up the entire width of the house.

The cost of this cottage home, with full cellar under the main part of the house, is estimated at \$1,500, exclusive of the heating, plumbing, electric work, and decorations. Price of plans and specifications, \$15.





ENGLISH COTTAGE DESIGN. NO. D-1309


We have chosen this little elevation as an example of a modified old English Cottage. Its simple lines and

the soft shadows cast by its projecting eaves give it a most charming home-like appearance.

The floor plan suggested carries out the old English feeling, with the entry screened by the ballaster of a most attractive stairway. The fireplace, in the corner of the living room, breaks out square from the wall so as not to have that crude appearance which so many corner fireplaces have, and the openings to the living room and the piazza flank it with pleasing symmetry. The piazza, on the side of the house, is just back far enough from the street to be away from the eyes of the curious and, being connected with the dining room, would make an ideal place for breakfast and supper on the long summer days. Connected with the kitchen is a pantry with space for the ice-box. One goes down cellar through the combined kitchen and outside entrance under the main stairs. It is also possible to go up stairs without going through the living room, by means of the three steps and the door opening on to the main stair landing. On the second floor are three bedrooms with good sized closets.

The cost of this house is about \$1,450, exclusive of plumbing, heating, electric work and decorations. Price

SEASHORE BUNGALOW DESIGN. NO. D-1310


We have selected this cement covered bungalow as a type particularly adapted for a seashore house, where there is little protection from the hot rays of the sun. The sweeping roof, with its broad overhanging eaves acts as a huge parasol, keeping off the hot sun and shading the windows and porch.


The suggested plan is particularly attractive for a house of this kind. The bedrooms, bath and stairs to attic all open on to a centre hall from which egress can be had through the side entrance. This is especially

desirable when located near enough to the beach to dress for bathing in the bedrooms. A plan is also shown indicating how four additional rooms could be had on the second floor.

The cost of this bungalow, attic unfinished, is about \$1,525, exclusive of heating, plumbing, electric work,

and decorations. Cost of plans and specifications \$15.







SWISS CHALET DESIGN. NO. D-1311

This attractive cottage has been chosen, as an interesting example of the adaptability of the Swiss Chalet, in modified form, for use in the suburbs of our large cities. The exterior is entirely pleasing, with the soft harmonizing textures of the brick and stucco. The eaves of the sun roof running along the front, forming a protective covering for the main entrance, and the flower box and lattice at the window give it a restful and

inviting appearance.


The living room of the suggested plan lies with its broad side to the front, opening at one end through a wide archway into the dining room and at the other through a pair of glass doors to the sun room, making practically one great room. The stairway does not break into the living room but is reached through an archway alongside the fireplace. In the stair recess is a coat closet under the slant of the returning stairs, and at the side, a door opening into the kitchen. Descending from the kitchen and under the main flight is the combined kitchen and outside cellarway, which does away with the troublesome outside trap door. Connecting with the kitchen is the entry with space for ice-box, and from which opens a separate toilet room. Leading from the pantry is the maid's room. Should it be desired, however, this would make a very pleasant breakfast room.

The plan is compact and economical in arrangement. The kitchen range and the fireplace occupy the same

chimney, and the plumbing of the kitchen and bath are all in one line.

There are three bedrooms and bath on the second floor. The irregular shape of the rooms invites many interesting decorative effects and the window alcoves suggest window seats, and could be provided with curtains hung for drawing.

A full cellar is provided under the main part of the house and contains laundry and cold-storage room. The estimated cost of this house, exclusive of heating, plumbing, electric work, and decorations is about \$1,575. Price of plans and specifications, \$15.





CALIFORNIA BUNGALOW DESIGN. No. D-1312

This cozy little bungalow has been selected for its many desirable possibilities in floor plan arrangement. The exterior is extremely simple and economical in construction. The main part of the house is devoid of any attempt at decoration, depending entirely upon its proportions for effect. The whole attractiveness of the design lies in the alcove extension to living room, with its well proportioned casement windows and the little entrance porch nestled at the side. The house is covered with siding up to a belt course, carried along the tops of the windows, and with shingles above. As it stands this little bungalow is very attractive, and with the addition of some shrubbery planted around the base, and a few well placed bushes about the ground, it will have a most charming homelike appearance.

The floor plan, herewith suggested, is thoroughly practical and offers many domestic conveniences. The bedrooms are light and airy, each having windows on two sides. Closets are provided in each room and in addition, a large closet, for soiled clothing, is located opening into the bathroom, and ventilated through louvers just under the eaves. There is also a linen closet in the hall. The kitchen is of good size and conveniently arranged. It has a doorway opening on

veniently arranged. It has a doorway opening on to the cellar stairs and also one opening into the bedroom hall. The dining room has windows on two sides and connects with the kitchen through a butler's pantry. A dresser with counter shelves running full length provides ample room for the stowage of china, etc. The living room should make a very attractive apartment. Low bookcases could be built in the recesses on each side of the fireplace and with the walls finished as an effective background, this would make a most appropriate setting for a worthy cast or a touch of bright color.

The alcove could be very prettily arranged, and with a couple of willow chairs, a small table and some soft pillows, for the window seat, would make


a most charming little retreat.

If more bedrooms were desired the pitch of the roof could be slightly increased and dormers built in the side. This would allow for three good bedrooms in the attic. A stairway could be built going up over the cellar stairs and starting from the present linen closet. If more porch room were desired the present porch could be extended across the front. If this were done, the porch could be given a pergola treatment, or the main roof could be extended, as it is, or hipped as far back as the present roof line leaving a small gable for ventilating purposes

There is a full basement under the rear portion of the house, where are located a laundry, storage

closet, fuel bins, etc.

The cost of this bungalow home is estimated at \$1,550, exclusive of heating, plumbing, electric work, and decorations. Price of plans and specifications, \$15.





SHINGLE AND STUCCO COTTAGE—NO. D-1313


The above is selected as a representative type of economical and attractive home construction. The porch is simply but effectively detailed and the appealing combination of shingles and stucco together with the well

placed and proportioned windows have given this little cottage a most pleasing appearance.


The floor plan, suggested below, shows a very agreeable disposition of rooms. These are all of generous size and located so that each will get light and air from two sides. All space has been used to the best advantage with only a very small amount on the second floor given over to hall. The main entrance is from the sheltered living porch directly into the living room. Here an open fireplace with a cozy seat tucked under the ascending stair offers a cheering welcome, and a wide opening at the side leads to the dining room. This is an ample room and separated from the kitchen by a generous pantry equipped with dresser, counter, and a large closet ventilated by a window which could be used for a refrigerator or for pots and storage. Admission to the kitchen from the outside is had through a side entry from which also descends the cellar stairs. The second floor provides for four generous bedrooms and bath. An ample closet is provided for each chamber. A basement with cement floor extends under the entire house.

The estimated cost is \$1,450 exclusive of heating, plumbing, electric work, and decorations. Price of plans

The above depicts a pleasing and inexpensive Bungalow home in stucco. The front dormer is well placed. and effectively breaks the plain of the roof and affords sufficient ventilation to the attic. The triple transomed windows and hospitable entrance porch, with outlines softened by the shadows of the wide projecting eaves,

effect a most charming approach.

The floor plan, suggested to the left, has the merits of simplicity of treatment and economy of space. The generous living room, 13 feet wide and 26 feet long, extends across the entire width of the house. Windows are provided on three sides assuring a plentiful amount of sunlight and fresh air. An open fireplace with deep brick hearth, has been very nicely and simply worked into the end of the living room. Bookcases, with leaded glass doors, are built in the recesses on either side of the fireplace and above are casement windows glazed with art glass. This attractively and completely furnishes one end of the room. A well proportioned dining room, practically part of the living room, and separated only by a post and panel treatment adjoins at the rear. A buffet with drawers and cupboards, is built recessed in the rear wall, and little classes with leaded glass doors are worked in above closets with leaded glass doors, are worked in above. Doors to either side lead to kitchen, and bedroom

hall. The kitchen is furnished with a roomy dresser and other conveniences. Refrigerator space is arranged in the adjoining entry. A hall entered from the dining room opens into the bedroom and bath. The bedrooms are each provided with closets. These are ventilated into the attic through registers in the ceiling. A basement extends under the entire house, sup-

plying ample room for laundry, heating apparatus,

cold storage closet, fuel bins, etc.

The foundation walls could be built of concrete or stone according to the material at hand. The living rooms are trimmed with cypress, stained and wax finished, and the bedrooms in pine or poplar, painted an ivory white with mahogany stained doors.

The estimated cost of this practical bungalow home is \$1,300, exclusive of the heating, plumbing, electric work, and decorations. Price of plans and specifications




AN ARTISTIC CALIFORNIA BUNGALOW. DESIGN NO. D-1315

A typical California Bungalow is shown in the above illustration. The sweeping roof lines and wide projecting eaves are characteristic, and the broad span of the porch beam and the battering porch columns and chimney lend a massive and solid effect to balance the overhanging roof. The exterior is designed to be covered with wide siding up to the top of the first story windows and with shingles above. The shingles are laid in alternating courses of 2 inch and 6 inch exposure to the weather. This gives a very pleasing effect, which harmonizes with the brick and cobble stone in the foundation, porch walls, and chimney.

The entrance, in the floor plan here suggested, is direct into the generous living room. This is a very attractive room and windows are provided on three sides offering an abundance of fresh air and sunlight. At one end of the room is a large fireplace, with flanking built-in bookcases. On one side the bookcase is returned along the side wall with a double casement window above. To the rear is the dining room with direct communication to the kitchen. Adjoining the kitchen is the combined cellar and kitchen entrance. There is also a doorway leading to the main stair recess. This is one step above the living room and has a coat closet at the right of the stairs. On the second floor are three bedrooms and bath. A basement extends under the entire house.

The estimated cost is \$1,500, exclusive of heating, plumbing, electric work, and decorations. Price of plans and specifications \$15.00






AN INEXPENSIVE BUNGALOW. DESIGN NO. D-1316

The illustration here shown depicts a cozy little bungalow, homelike in every feature. The exterior is well proportioned and the high window with its hanging flower box gives an interesting variation to the approach.

The living room in the floor plan suggested for this elevation, entered from the porch, serves as a dining room as well. An open fireplace with deep brick hearth, invites the family gathering when days are cool and makes, at all times, a decorative feature for the entire room. The chimney serves also for the flue from the range in the kitchen, directly adjoining the living room. The kitchen contains a roomy closet for pots or, if desired, to be used for the refrigerator. There is also a good sized dresser and in addition, a hanging closet over the drain board to the kitchen sink. A door in the living room opens into a connecting hallway between bedrooms and bath. Each bedroom is furnished with a good sized closet. A small cellar is provided under the kitchen and the adjoining bedroom. The balance of the house rests on a trench wall carried down below frost.

The estimated cost of this cozy little Bungalow home, according to the suggested floor plan is \$800, exclusive of heating, plumbing, electric work, and decorations. Price of plans and specifications \$10.00.

D-1316B offers a suggestion where only one bedroom is required. In this plan the living room is a little larger than in D-1316 and the fireplace is placed against the rear wall. At the end of the room a door leads to a little square or lobby on which opens the bedroom, bath and a closet. To the rear of the living room, and connecting through a wide opening at the left of the fireplace, is a fair sized dining room. Mullion windows are built in the outside walls, assuring light and fresh air in plenty. A cellar is provided under the rear portion of the house. The foundation could be built of stone, concrete, or tile, according to the material at hand.





SHINGLE BUNGALOW. DESIGN NO. D-1317


The illustration here shown depicts a cozy bungalow homelike in every feature. An attractive note is


struck by the long sweep of the roof and the well proportioned dormer.

The practical and economical features of the floor plan, suggested for this artistic elevation, will commend it to the housewife. Centrally located, the front door opens into a generous living room, 13 feet wide and 26 feet 6 inches long. The most important feature of this room is the open fireplace with book cases built in on either side. To the rear is a well lighted dining room. The kitchen, furnished with dresser, hanging closet over the refrigerator and other conveniences, gives on to a rear porch, having separate door for ice delivery to the refrigerator. Three bedrooms with ample closet space, open onto a hallway which connects with bath, kitchen, and dining room.

The second floor plan, here suggested, shows how three bedrooms and bath could be secured in the attic if desired.






TYPICAL CALIFORNIA BUNGALOW. DESIGN NO. D-1318

An exceedingly fine example of a Bungalow built on artistic lines is shown in this elevation. The side walls are plastered with cement mortar. An interesting feature in the elevation is the way the sills and head-casings of the windows have been carried continuously around the house forming various sized panels in the stucco. Much charm is due to the entrance porch with its substantial columns and the well detailed gable treatment.

The living room in the floor plan suggested below is entered through a vestibule from the front porch. An artistic fireplace with book cases built in on either side below casement windows completely furnishes one end of this desirable room. A wide window gives a panoramic view of the front garden and approach. Beyond is the dining room with a wide bay affording views to both front and rear. The centre window of the bay



is raised to accommodate a china or glass closet A veranda with extended balcony overlooks the garden and connects with the dining room through a pair of glass doors. This will make a charming little corner and with an awning shading the balcony form a most artistic spot for outdoor dining. Service can be had from the kitchen through the diningroom. The kitchen is well arranged with a roomy dresser and a good sized pantry. Alongside the range is a large ventilated store closet and opposite an entry with provision made for a refrigerator, leading to a service porch. The kitchen connects with the bedroom hall and basement through the pantry. Two bedrooms and bath are provided. The front bedroom is unusually desirable having a bay window exposure to the front. Both bedrooms have windows on two sides and are thus assured of an abundance of fresh air and sunlight. The bedroom closets are ventilated to the attic through registers in the ceilings. The attic is provided with ventilating louvres in the front gable. A full basement extends under the kitchen, dining room and pantry. The laundry is located under the kitchen and a cold storage closet under the pantry. The balance of the basement provides ample room for heating aparatus and fuel bins.

THREE-ROOM BUNGALOW. DESIGN NO. D-1319


Above is shown a small bungalow of unusual attractiveness. The shallow bays, with grouped windows, give







COLONIAL COTTAGE. DESIGN NO. D-1321







A SOUTHERN BUNGALOW DESIGN. No. D-1205

This design offers an extremely practical solution of the Bungalow home. The exterior is simple and pleasing in detail. The dormer in the front is in good proportion and is a decorative feature against the other-

wise plain expanse of roof. As the house is planned, the dormer is used for ventilating purposes only.

The floor plan is well arranged with a view to decorative and domestic purposes. The living room and parlor, connected by a wide columned archway, occupy the entire front of the house. At the rear of the living room is a large dining room with openings into the kitchen and bedroom hall. A china closet is built in between the windows of the outside wall, and on the opposite side of the room is a large sliding door, opening into a good sized room that could be used for either a bedroom or library. 
The kitchen opens onto a rear porch and is amply supplied with cupboards and counter space. By raising the pitch of the roof and putting in dormers on each side, in addition to the one in front, it would be possible to secure three bedrooms in the attic; to do this, however, it would be necessary to sacrifice the rear bedroom adjoining the kitchen for stair room. The stairs could begin to go up a little further front than where the present

stair-way starts to descend, but on the right-hand side of the partition. As the new stairs would not take up the entire width of the bedroom, the kitchen could be widened to use up the remaining space. With this planning, the cellarstairs would start from the kitchen and go down under the new flight. The room taken up by the old cellar-stairs would now become valuable closet room. Part could be used for a closet to the corner bedroom and the balance for a linen closet opening into the hall. The break in the corner bedroom, necessary for sufficient closet room in the arrangement as shown, could now be done away with and so greatly increase the size of that room.

The foundation is of split field stone. An interesting effect has been secured by carrying up the stone of the foundation to form pedestals for the porch columns. The basement contains laundry room, fuel bins and storage closet with ample space for the

heating apparatus, etc.

The cost of this dwelling would of course be considerably increased by making a finished second story. but if the room were necessary, it could be secured in this manner as economically as in any other design. The estimated cost, not including the finishing of the attic and exclusive of the heating, plumbing, electric work and decorations is \$1,550. Plans and specifications, \$15.






AN ATTRACTIVE BUNGALOW. DESIGN NO. D-1065


ONE AND A HALF-STORY COTTAGE. DESIGN NO. D-1070


would give a very pretty effect.

The floor plan is economical in arrangement and shows a reception hall with wide connecting openings into the living room and the dining room. The boiler in the kitchen could be moved into the corner and a cellar doorway put alongside the chimney.

The interior finish is of pine, poplar or cypress,



The practical location of the two bedrooms in connection with small rear hall, giving access from each to bathroom, is especially desirable. So many bungalows are built without any kind of decent closet room. Here we have three large closets, quite unusual, besides an extra closet in rear bedroom. It was thought the hall closet would answer of necessity for overflow from rear bedroom. SECOND FLOOR PLAN






SECOND FLOOR PLAN








BUNGALOW. DESIGN NO. D-535

As this cottage was proportioned to its owners' needs as well as their purses, the rooms are few, but large and airy. The great large room nearly thirty feet long is an ideal living room and serves the purpose of both a sitting and dining room. The fireplace is of rough field stone, broken so as to show the varied coloring and glistening quartz formations. As it is in the centre of the house, the one chimney serves for both fireplace and kitchen stove. The rear of the house is taken up by a coat and storage room, adjoining stair recess, with stairway to the second floor and basement stairs going down below, then a good sized kitchen with the conveniences of a sink and cupboard, which has enclosed shelves, drawers and flour bins on rollers. This is a desirable feature for it gives a general spacious effect and permits the breezes to pass through the front rooms. A roomy coat closet is under the returning stairs and a door at the rear opens into the library. 



A MODERN COTTAGE HOME. DESIGN NO. D-646

SHOOTING LODGE DESIGN NO. D-802


rooms in front and two in the rear instead of one as at present.

The exterior is covered with siding up to a belt course and with shingles above. The interior is intended to be trimmed in cypress, stained and wax finished for the living room, dining room, and hall, and varnished natural in the kitchen, and in pine for bedrooms and bath, painted.


A ONE AND A HALF STORY COTTAGE. DESIGN NO. D-137

A design especially adapted for the South or the country and one well arranged for a corner lot. The recessed porch will be found a delightful place on a hot day and, if desired, could be extended and carried across the front. One enters into an ample hall or foyer from which one can pass into the parlor, dining room, and one of the bedrooms. The dining room is a pleasant room with a wide bay offering views to both front The kitchen is conveniently arranged with stairways to basement and second floor. is a good sized porch which would make an enjoyable place for doing many of the little duties connected with the preparation of a meal. The two bedrooms are very desirable rooms with windows on two sides. The central chamber opening off the hall, if not required as such, would make a very attractive library or study. On the second floor we have three rooms and plenty of closet room can be obtained under the slope of the roof. The large room is 11 feet by 23 feet 6 inches in size and by running a hallway, a continuation of stair landing, through it, another bedroom could be obtained. This would give access to the front chamber without the necessity of going through the centre room as at present. The small room at the head of the stairs would make a desirable bathroom.

SUBURBAN HOME. DESIGN NO. D-102

This is a design for a cottage home for a person who wishes to live economically and has a thousand dol-

lars or less to spend in the building of his house.

For practical purposes, it will be found exceedingly convenient. The living room is of good size and is entered directly from the generous front porch. The stairway at the rear of the living room makes a very pretty feature and its location there effects a very economical use of floor space. By utilizing the space under the stairway an entry from the rear porch is provided communicating with the kitchen, living room and cellarway. Off of the living room is a closet, with ample shelving room for china, etc., arranged with a slide window opening on to a counter shelf in the kitchen. If a bedroom were not desired upon the ground floor, the room so designed could be used for a dining room with wide cased opening connecting with living room.


Three bedrooms and bath are planned on the second floor. These rooms are of generous size and each have windows on two sides affording efficient ventilation. Roomy closets are provided under the slope of the roof.

The exterior is covered with siding up to a belt course with shingles above and in the gables.

finish is intended to be of pine, cypress, or poplar throughout, according to the section where built.

A COMPLETE HOUSE. DESIGN NO. D-60

In the sixtieth design we have an example of what may be accomplished in the way of a complete home for a very moderate sum.

This design, it will be noticed, provides for quite a spacious house. The sitting room is of most generous proportions, and from it, across the hall and into the parlor and dining room opposite, a most attractive vista would be obtained. The pantry and kitchen arrangements and refrigerator entry are all provided, and on the second floor there are four very nice bed chambers, a bathroom and most ample closets.

In this case the interior finish would be pine, neatly painted, though, of course, hard woods might be used if desired at very little additional cost. Many, however, are fully as well satisfied with pine, painted or stained in attractive combinations, as the color effects can be obtained in wide variety.




FRENCH COTTAGE. DESIGN NO. D-61

Here we have a most compact and practical arrangement. The reception hall is square and embellished with a pretty stairway along the side, in front of which is a seat and under which is a good roomy coat closet. Space is also arranged for a chair or two, so that it is a reception hall, in fact, as well as name. The living room is arranged with an open fireplace and bookcase recessed at the side and is separated from the dining room by a sliding door. The kitchen is well equipped and connects with the dining room through a generous pan-Refrigerator space is provided in the entry from rear porch. A full flight of back stairs is provided, under which is the outside cellar entrance. The plans for this design are drawn for a full height second story, instead of story and one half, as shown. Lowest point in second floor rooms six feet. Cost can be reduced by small cellar and pine finish.

Cost \$1,700, exclusive of heating, plumbing, electric work, and decorations. Width 31 feet 10 inches. Depth 32 feet 6 inches. Height of basement 7 feet 4 inches. First story 9 feet 3 inches. Second story,

A ROOMY COTTAGE HOME—DESIGN NO. D-148.

This is one of the most popular designs that I have ever published. Notice the large parlor and ingle-nook with its cozy seats and fireplace. The library or study in the corner connected by a wide cased opening with the parlor, and also the very pretty and good-sized reception hall will make a most attractive and in-

teresting interior.

This design is favored with an unusually large pantry fitted with moulding board, enclosed shelves, drawers, cupboards and flour bins. Three very generous rooms with ample closets are arranged on the second floor. Hardwood floors are intended for the hall, dining room, pantry, kitchen, and bathroom. In the basement is a laundry with wood floor, the balance of the cellar floor being of concrete finished with cement. Coal bins are provided, also an outside cellar entrance which will be found very convenient for carrying out ashes, etc. In this house, as in all houses where there is a full basement, an ash pit is provided for the fireplace. The house is arranged to be heated by a hot air heating system. The finish is of pine, cypress, or poplar painted. The exterior finish is of siding for the first story and shingles above.

PHYSICIAN'S COTTAGE. DESIGN NO. D-185

A cozy cottage admirably adapted for a physician's or a clergyman's home. An office is provided adjoining the dining room with separate outside entrance from the side porch. The family entrance is from the front porch into a central hall. Wide cased openings connect with the parlor at the side, and to the rear with a very attractive dining room. This has a china closet built in one corner and a pantry gives access to the kitchen. Two bedrooms and bath are provided. The bath opens into the hall and also opens directly into each bedroom. The second floor supplies another bedroom and generous storage space. A basement extends under the entire house and furnishes ample room for laundry, cold storage closet, and fuel bins. Provision is made for a hot air heating and ventilating system. The exterior is finished with siding and shingles are used for the roof and gables.

Cost \$1,650, exclusive of heating, plumbing, electric work, and decorations. Width 36 feet; depth 44 feet 8 inches. Height of basement 8 feet; first story 9 feet 9 inches; second story 8 feet; lowest height of


A PRACTICAL SQUARE HOUSE. DESIGN NO. D-189

This is a very practical type of house and is very economical to build as there is hardly any waste in structural material. On the first floor are three rooms, hall and a bathroom adjoining the kitchen for economy in plumbing. The sitting room is very pleasant and has a large unbroken window to the front giving a view of the garden and approach. To the rear and separated by a pair of sliding doors is a good sized dining room. This connects with the kitchen through a pantry furnished with ample shelving and cupboards. The kitchen is furnished with laundry trays and opens on to a rear porch. The second floor shows an arrangement of four bedrooms with ample closets. If preferred, the bath room could be arranged on this floor and the space occupied by the present bath used as a pantry or the jog could be taken out of the kitchen and the space used as part of the dining room. Then, the sitting room could be extended as far back as the rear of the entrance hall. This would do away with the pantry, but sufficient cupboard room could be provided in the kitchen. There is a generous attic and one or two rooms could be secured, if desired.

SUMMER COTTAGE. DESIGN NO. D-1

The main and perhaps the most attractive feature of this plan is the unusually fine, large sitting room with its open fire and pleasant outlook. If desired the rear portion could be partitioned off for a bedroom, for such event it might be well to increase the depth of house a foot or so.

The kitchen is of good size and so located that the main chimney serves it. It has a roomy cupboard

at one end with a place for pots, kettles, etc., and the sink is convenient to the pantry.


Directly in front, as the hall is entered, is the stairway, rising three steps to a landing and then turning to the right. Much space and expense is here saved by combining the front and back stairs from the first landing, as shown on the plan; entrance to the kitchen being had from a door on this first landing.

Examination of this design will show a most convenient, compact and economical arrangement of rooms, with no space wasted and yet a most charming and generous sized interior effect is obtained. The finish is

intended to be of pine or poplar, painted or stained.

COTTAGE. DESIGN NO. D-13

In this design we have a somewhat larger house with every facility of arrangement and convenience shown

in the preceding design and more.

There is a basement with cement floor under the entire house, so that the house can be heated by a The sitting room is large and has the luxury of an open fire with a bookcase built in the furnace if desired. recess at the side.

The dining room is of good size and communicates with the kitchen through a very nice pantry.

It is generally an advantage much appreciated by the housewife to have a family bedroom of good size, and in this design her wants in this respect are fully provided for, as the room is ample to take a child's bed in addition to the regular furniture. The bathroom is amply large for the fixtures it accommodates, and from it opens a good sized linen closet, utilizing the space under the slope of the roof, as the space under the other side is utilized for closets. The finish is intended to be of pine or poplar. The exterior is covered with siding. The foundation can be of stone or brick or if good sharp sand can be secured from the excavation for cellar, of concrete.

ENGLISH COTTAGE. DESIGN NO. D-204

The above is one of the most successful cottage designs that I have ever published. Note the large sized sitting room and its cozy inglenook with inviting open fireplace and seats built at the side, the library or study in the front corner, connecting by a wide opening with the sitting room and dining room, also the very pretty and good size reception hall and ground-floor bedroom with adjoining bath. This house is enlarged from No. 148 with several features added, and it cannot be equalled for the amount of available floor space.

Were it desired, the bathroom could be placed in the small rear chamber on the second floor and the space now occupied by the bath used for a back stairway. This would do away with the present cellar stairs, as access to the basement would then be gained under this stairway. With this arrangement, the kitchen could be enlarged and the pantry arranged so as to serve through it to the dining room. The house might be built two full stories in height and in that case the second floor rooms would be considerably increased in The finish is intended to be of pine or poplar painted, with hardwood floors.

The estimated cost is \$2,000, exclusive of heating, plumbing, electric work, and decorations. Width 28 feet 6 inches; depth 33 feet; height of basement 7 feet 8 inches. First story 10 feet 3 inches. Second story 9 feet 3 inches. Lowest height, second story 5 feet. Plans and specifications \$20.



COTTAGE. DESIGN NO. D-205

Here we have what is really a combination of designs, No. 139 and 148, and it makes a very attractive house, from either kitchen or front hall. The principal rooms are separated by sliding doors which when open allow them to open up together very nicely. The inglenook in the sitting room is very inviting with its cheery fireplace and seats built in at the sides. A row of bookcases under a group of high windows completely finishes one side. The dining room adjoining at the rear has a wide bay window and connects with the kitchen through a generous pantry. Off of the kitchen is a large rear porch which if widened a little would make a very delightful place for outdoor dining.

Three bedrooms and bath are arranged on the second floor. Ample closets are secured under the slope The front bedroom is a very desirable room as it has an alcove at the side which would make

an attractive dressing or child's room.

The first floor, with the exception of the kitchen and pantry, is intended to be trimmed in oak with paneled

wainscoting in the hall and hardwood floors throughout; the balance of the house in pine, painted.

Cost \$2,000, exclusive of heating, plumbing, electric work, and decorations. Width 31 feet 6 inches; depth 32 feet 3 inches; height of basement 8 feet; first story 9 feet 6 inches; second story 8 feet 6 inches; lowest height, second story, 7 feet. Plans and specifications \$20.




SEASIDE COTTAGE. DESIGN NO. D-238


A cozy cottage for seaside or mountain. It is not intended to be plastered. This same plan would make a very nice little home for occupancy all the year round if built for that purpose. The piazza runs clear around the house, and is wide and well covered at front and rear. Quite an addition to the size of this cottage and the ground floor space could be effected by using the present kitchen for a dining room and enclosing the rear porch, making there a kitchen and pantry or instead of a pantry a small bedroom could be secured. These rooms could be made as large as desired by simply extending back further. No cellar is planned, a small round cellar 10 to 12 feet in diameter, built of a four inch brick wall, would cost \$25 or \$30 additional, while \$75 would cover the cost of plastering the house. This design has been built at the seashore in New Jersey and on the shores of Lake Minnetonka, giving the best of satisfaction. Pine finish.

SHINGLED COTTAGE. DESIGN NO. D-107

The appearance of this cottage is very fine and the plan calls for the requisite number of rooms, all pleas-

antly situated, that are usually deemed necessary for the average family.

A basement extends under the main part of the house. On the first floor the hall, entered through a vestibule from the front porch, opens into sitting room, parlor, and dining room. If desired, the closet in the parlor could be arranged to open into the vestibule and make a convenient hanging place for coats and wraps. The sitting room has an open fireplace with deep brick hearth and will make a very pleasant interior. Off the hall to the rear is a dining room of good size which has a well designed sideboard built in between the pantry and hall doors. The kitchen connects through an ample pantry, furnished with cupboards and work table. The combination stairway to the second floor is especially economical of space and provides direct access from the kitchen to the front door and the floor above.

Oak finish is intended for the parlor, hall and vestibule, sitting room and dining room; balance of first

story, pine; second story, pine or poplar.


SUBURBAN COTTAGE. DESIGN NO. D-210

The above is a tasty little cottage which has those little touches in it, in the way of a pretty fireplace with ornamental book shelves on either side, a built-in china closet in the dining room, an attractive stairway and a well equipped pantry, that will make it a tasteful home for the most refined family. No cellar is provided as same is often dispensed with in the South or California. If one is desired, a stairway could be put in from the pantry where the closet is shown opening into the dining room.


If this plan is desired providing a full basement with cellar stairs leading out of the kitchen next to dining room partition, also an outside cellar entrance, a shed and porch on the rear with the dining room closet, and a vestibule making a side or rear entrance from the porch, call for Design No. 210A, cost \$1,490. The house

is plastered and finished in pine or cypress.

SUMMER COTTAGE. DESIGN NO. D-209

This house was planned for a summer cottage and no plaster only dressed boarding is intended for interior partitions. The porch is carried around on three sides. The living room is entered directly from the porch. At one end an inviting firepleace has been nicely and simply worked in with comfortable seats on either side. At the opposite end of the room a wide columned archway connects with the parlor allowing the two rooms to open up very nicely together. This makes a very attractive arrangement as with windows on four sides a breeze can be had from every direction and together with the stairway makes a very charming interior. A coat closet is provided in the passage to the kitchen. Here also is an entrance to the dining room and basement stairs. The kitchen is well arranged and has a commodious pantry equipped with enclosed shelving and counter shelf with drawers and cupboards below.

Five bedrooms and bath are shown on the second floor. Each is furnished with ample closets. The bedroom over the living room has many desirable features such as the windows on opposite sides providing per-

fect circulation of air and an open fireplace.

A flight of steps, ascending over those from the first floor, lead to a very good attic where a number of rooms could be secured if desired.

This design would make an admirable design for a suburban home. Building it for occupancy the year round would in most cases necessitate a full basement with cement floor, plastering, additional finish, etc., which would increase the cost to nearly \$2,500.

The estimated cost is \$1,900, exclusive of heating, plumbing, electric work, and decorations. Width 39 feet; depth 33 feet 6 inches. Height of first story 9 feet 5 inches; second story 8 feet 3 inches. Plans and

SUMMER COTTAGE. DESIGN NO. D-194


A perfect summer cottage for the seaside, mountains or lake shore. There is a splendid ten-foot porch entirely around the cottage. The kitchen is separated from the house at the rear by this porch. Five bedrooms are provided and a magnificent living room with a generous fire makes this design ideal in every respect. It is intended to give a very unique effect by building the fireplace of boulders with a sloping roof of cut shingles. It was also thought to leave the rooms open right up to the rafters, the bedrooms being merely partitioned off at a height of about ten feet.

The sleeping space might be further increased and a very unique and attractive effect obtained by putting in a second floor, reached by a little stairway in the rear corner of the living room. In this event, leave a large open "well" directly in front of the fireplace, forming a balcony of the second floor from which to look down

on the fire and living room. The bedrooms could be obtained in the gable ends. Post foundation only was intended with pine or poplar finish painted or stained.

Cost \$1,250, exclusive of heating, plumbing, electric work, and decorations. Width 42 feet; depth 25 feet. Height of first story 11 feet. Plans and specifications \$12.






GAMBREL ROOF HOUSE. DESIGN NO. D-44

In the floor arrangement of this design I have striven to meet the ideas of the majority of people who want a comfortable and conveniently arranged low cost house. The sitting room would, of course, be placed upon the pleasant facing, and, being of good size, and having in addition an "inglenook," will make the family gathering place as it should be, the most pleasant part of the house. The covers of the seats in the inglenook should be made to lift, making boxes in which to store away papers or magazines, while the space under the hall seat could be used for rubbers, mackintoshes, skates, and tennis rackets. The dining room has a large bay to the side, which gives a view to the front of the house. A pantry with ample dresser space and work table with drawers and cupboards below connects with the kitchen. This is conveniently arranged with inside cellar way and four steps to a landing on the main stair, giving easy passage to the front door and second floor

On the second floor are four bedrooms and a bathroom, while in the attic there would be space for a

servant's room and trunk storage if desired. Finish, cypress, pine, or poplar.

Cost \$1,450, exclusive of heating, plumbing, electric work, and decorations. Width 27 feet; depth 27 feet 10 inches. Height of basement 7 feet. First story 8 feet 3 inches. Second story 9 feet 3 inches. Lowest height of second story 5 feet. Plans and specifications \$14.



FRAME COTTAGE. DESIGN NO. D-144

In this design we have a cozy and attractive little home especially adapted to a narrow lot, the total width being only 21 feet 6 inches. Notwithstanding this, the rooms are all of good size. The stairway, which is partially open, lands in the centre of the second floor, thus no room is wasted in halls. The bedrooms are well provided with closets. If the bedroom on the first story were not required as such it would make a very pleasant dining room and a door could be arranged to open into the kitchen.

A cellar 10 feet square is provided, and if it were desired a full basement could readily be arranged at an

additional expense of about \$150 to \$175.

The exterior of this complete little home is of siding and shingles; there is also a piece of half timber work on the front which relieves the sameness, while the heavy cornice sets the house off with excellent effect. Ten foot studding is used but by using 12 foot a much better height of the second story rooms could be obtained. The finish is of pine, cypress or poplar.

Cost \$950, exclusive of heating, plumbing, electric work, and decorations. Width 21 feet 6 inches; depth 32 feet 6 inches. Small cellar. Height first story 9 feet 6 inches. Height second story 8 feet 2 inches. Lowest height second story 3 feet 8 inches. Plans and specifications \$8.



AN INTERESTING COTTAGE HOME. DESIGN NO. D-62

The stairway and coat closet are partially screened from view, making a very pretty effect, as one enters the hall. In this deisgn the plan of having the dining room on the front of the house is adopted. It is an attractive room and has a well detailed china closet built in one corner. On the second floor the size and arrangement of the four chambers leave nothing to be desired, and the bathroom is centrally located and con-

venient to all. The attic would be quite large and provide ample storage.

The hall is of very pretty shape, of good size, and very much embellished by the reception alcove, separated from it by a wide arch. This nook, fitted up in Turkish fashion, perhaps, with its cushioned seat and a plentiful supply of pillows, will make a very cozy retreat. The living room adjoining is of generous size and has an open fireplace with deep brick hearth. The study to the rear is a very cozy little room with bookcases against the rear wall.

The exterior, with its bold yet simple treatment, is not only pleasing, but economical of construction,

and the plan presents many attractive and unique features. Finish, oak, cypress, and pine.

Cost \$2,000, exclusive of heating, plumbing, electric work, and decorations. Width 36 feet; depth 27 feet. Height of basement 7 feet 6 inches. First story 9 feet 5 inches. Second story 8 feet 3 inches. Lowest height second story 6 feet. Plans and specifications \$20.



STONE COTTAGE. DESIGN NO. D-1229


Above is shown a very attractive cottage design for a stone exterior. The walls are intended to be of solid brick or tile faced with stone. The porch underpinning and rail are also of stone, making a thoroughly

substantial house in every way.

The plan is certainly difficult to better, as it contains every feature of convenience in arrangement and the practical use of every inch of space. There is a full basement with laundry and outside cellar entrance. The porch extends the width of the house and has a cement floor. A vestibule with a generous coat closet gives access to the hall, from which ascends the stairway to the second floor. A sliding door connects with the living room while a door at the rear provides easy access from the kitchen to the front door. An open fireplace gives cheer to the living-room and a pair of sliding doors separate it from the dining-room. The kitchen is arranged with an ample pantry and space for the refrigerator in entry from the side porch. On the second floor are shown three bedrooms and bath.

The finish of the first story is in oak or birch and of the second story in pine or fir.

Cost \$2,850, exclusive of heating, plumbing, electric work, and decorations. Width, 27 feet. Depth 39 feet 6 inches. Height of basement 7 feet 6 inches, first story 9 feet 3 inches, second story 8 feet 3 inches. Lowest height second story 7 feet. Plans and specifications \$20.



SHINGLE COTTAGE. DESIGN NO. D-1168

We have here a gambrel roof cottage design that possesses many attractive features. The basement foundation wall is of concrete and first and second stories are shingled. The floor plan is especially good in many respects. The entrance hall opens into the living room and den on either side and into the dining room, while the hall to the rear porch gives a vista of the garden beyond. The living room is separated from the hall by a pair of sliding doors and has an open fireplace with deep brick hearth. The dining room is unusually attractive, being 12 feet wide and 21 feet long. French windows open on to the wide rear veranda, which could be nicely used for a dining porch. The den to the right of the reception hall is a cozy little room arranged with an open fireplace and an inviting window bay. The kitchen is provided with ample cupboards and a ventilated closet for the refrigerator. Four chambers and a bath are arranged on the second floor. The large chamber to the left with its open fireplace is especially desirable. Generous closets are supplied under the slope of the roof and a door opens on to a balcony over the rear porch.

There is a full basement under the entire house with outside cellar entrance, laundry, store room, etc. The finish of the principal rooms of the first story is to be in oak or birch, with hardwood floors; the

This is a very complete modern bungalow. It has a concrete foundation, excavated so as to give a basement under the entire house, providing ample storage room and space for a hot air heater, laundry,

vegetable room, etc. Wherever it is desired to build this bungalow without the basement; the foundation walls, which can be of concrete, brick or stone, need only be carried down below the frost line or if in a Southern country where frost is not a controlling feature, the foundation could be laid upon the ground, and the side shingles carried down within a few inches of the

ground, a method often adopted in California.

Should these changes be desired or other slight adjustments or modifications, they are such, however, that with an intelligent builder, they can readily be arranged for in the plans as prepared, in accordance with the illustrations and description, which we can furnish for the nominal sum of \$25, by simply attaching a memo. of agreement to the contract with the builder, which will cover the matter and avoid the necessity of having plans prepared specially to order, just to technically provide for these matters.

The rooms of the first floor are ample in pro-


portions and the interior is most attractive in every way. The living room is a magnificent apartment, with a large fireplace in the corner, and connects by means of a wide archway, with the dining room at the rear. A little expense might be saved by omit-

ing the swelled end of the living room.

The bath is unusually large and equipped not only with the usual fixtures, closet, tub and lavatory, but also a sitz bath, which can of course be omitted if not desired. The pantry is completely fitted with The kitchen opens on to a rear porch or summer kitchen and a combination rear and cellar entrance is provided on cellar stair.

Oak floors are intended throughout the principal rooms of the first floor and the finish may be of plain hardwood, oak or birch, or cypress or southern pine, stained in many of the attractive shades of brown, green, etc., now so commonly used and so effective.

There is also an inside stair leading to the base-



ment and one to the attic, where there is provided ample storage space and two bed rooms. The front one is of especially good size. The lowest wall height in this room where the roof rafters begin to slope the ceiling, is four feet 6 inches.

Above the concrete foundation is a cement water table and the walls and roof are shingled. The gutter is of galvanized iron. The cement water table can be omitted and the ordinary wooden water table sub-

stituted.





The living room, centrally located, can be made most attractive and the wide openings into the various rooms on either side, with the open fireplace at the rear end opposite the entrance door, gives an atmosphere of friendliness and hospitality. On occasion, the music room, library and dining room, can all be divided from the living-room by sliding doors. The dining room connects with the kitchen through a butler's pantry. 
Refined simplicity is the predominant note in this little bungalow and the ungarnished roof, supported by

This design has created a great deal of favorable comment where erected. The foundation and porch walls are of cobble stone with upper walls of cement plaster, producing an artistic and refined effect.



on the first floor.




COLONIAL RESIDENCE—DESIGN NO. D-1204








MODERNIZED COLONIAL BUNGALOW. DESIGN NO. D-1028

CALIFORNIA BUNGALOW. DESIGN NO. D-1051

Extract from letter of patron who built this design in Ohio.

I do not think I ever invested money more profitably than that which I paid you for the plans used in building my house. I changed the design somewhat. As I remember it, the original plan called for an enclosed sun room or conservatory in the front of the house. I changed this to an open porch with three small round columns at each corner, the top being finished in accordance with your design. I also built the house of frame instead of brick, using narrow weather-boards. I also divided the basement into three rooms; finished the attic making one large room of it and used shingles stained with green instead of tile for the roof. The house was painted white with green trimmings.

I have lived in quite a number of houses—all kinds—but I feel perfectly frank in saying that for real comfort I have never occupied a house equal to this one. The plans were perfectly satisfactory in every way and with the exceptions noted, we followed them

exactly.

There would be no difficulty whatever in extending the main roof of this design so as to cover a porch entirely across the front, making it any width desired.


One attractive feature of this design is the window seats in several of the rooms, the sitting room having two of them. An ample number of fireplaces are provided, one being placed in the hall, the sitting room and dining room. The pantry is large and commodious and the servants' room off the kitchen can be used by a member of the family, if desired. If not, the door connecting with dining room should be omitted.

There is space in the attic for finishing off one large room and two smaller ones if desired, and still leave storage space.

A basement extends under the entire house and

plans call for hot air heating apparatus, outside cellar entrance and laundry. It is a modern house in every sense of the word, designed to be well and substantially built, the full basement making it dry and sanitary and easily heated, and offering unusual facilities for storage.




WOODLAND COTTAGE. DESIGN NO. D-1214



The floor plans are very interesting and show an appropriate layout of rooms. The wide porch extends around two sides and acts as a connecting link between the great outdoors and the fireside. 


LOG CABIN. DESIGN NO. D-1182

Above are given two elevations for a practical log cabin design which can be built for a reasonable sum, if material such as logs, boulders, field stone, etc., can be obtained in the locality where it is to be erected.

The foundation is of stone to be picked up on the premises, thus effecting quite a saving in the cost. In plan, the living room takes up the centre of the house, running clear through from side to side. A large fire-place of rustic design with hearth of smoothly dressed boulders effectively furnishes one end of the room. A pair of glass doors open on to a sheltered corner porch, and a door on the opposite side of the room opens on to the dining porch. There are three bedrooms, each with windows on two sides opening off the living room. The porch to the rear connects with the kitchen and makes a delightful outdoor dining room for use during the warm weather. At other times, the living room will have to act as dining room also. There are no attic rooms, but if the pitch of the roof were slightly increased, two additional rooms could be easily secured. A stairway could be built in a little addition, using part of the porch adjoining the front chamber. In the interior, the log walls could be left exposed and smoothed and wax finished, or they could be furred over and plastered.

The cost of this attractive little caoin is estimated at \$1,400, exclusive of any heating, plumbing, electric work, or decorations. The width is 32 feet and the depth, not including the connecting kitchen, is 41 ft. The price of plans and specifications is \$8.





SUMMER COTTAGE. DESIGN NO. D-356.

This is designed for a summer cottage or hunting lodge. The first story and foundation are of logs and the second story is sheathed and shingled. matter. It provides seven good-sized sleeping rooms on the second floor.







A CONCRETE AND SHINGLE COTTAGE. DESIGN NO. D-1242


blend charmingly with nature's setting.
