# GEORGE W. LAWTON, ARCHITECT, IS DEAD

### Pioneer Builder of Seattle Suc- cumbs in Hospital After Brief Illness.

**G**EORGE W. LAWTON, 63 years  
old, a prominent architect in  
Seattle for thirty-nine years and a

designer of many  
large buildings  
in the western  
part of the state  
as well as in  
Seattle, died in  
the Seattle Gen-  
eral Hospital to-  
day after a brief  
illness. He re-  
sided at 1618 35th  
Ave.

Born in Wis-  
consin, Mr. Law-  
ton came to Se-  
attle in 1889. He  
became asso-  
ciated with the  
architectural  
firm of Saunders and Lawton, con-  
tinuing with that organization for  
seventeen years. In 1906 he became  
head of Lawton and Moldenhour,  
and during the last twenty-two  
years, he had designed many struc-  
tures.

Mr. Lawton was a member of the  
Arctic Club, and was prominent in  
Masonic circles. He is survived by  
his widow, Mrs. Lois M. Lawton, and  
two daughters, Winona and Ruth.  
The former has been in Honolulu,  
and funeral services, which will be  
in charge of Masonic organizations,  
will be delayed until she arrives in  
Seattle.
