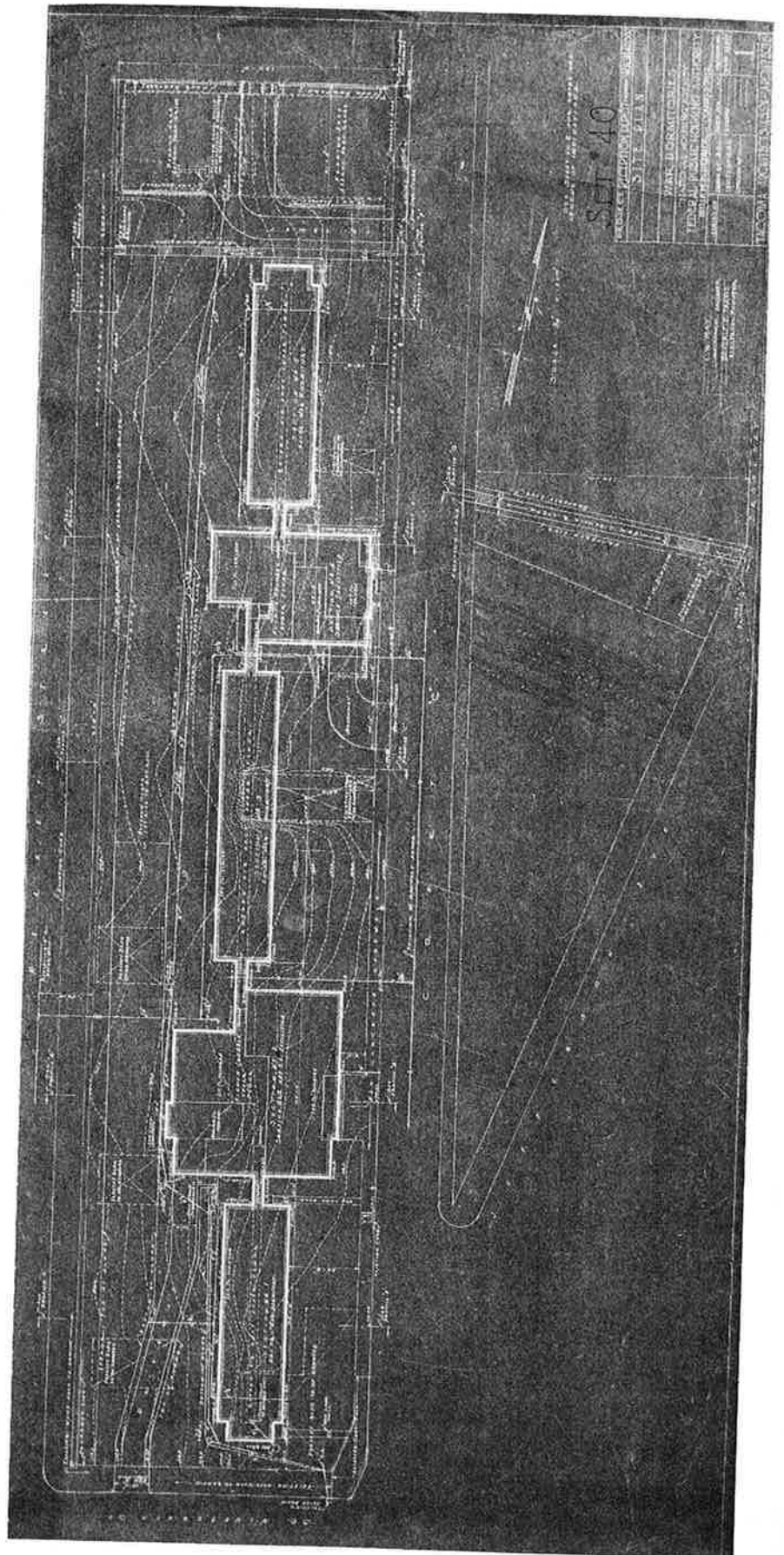


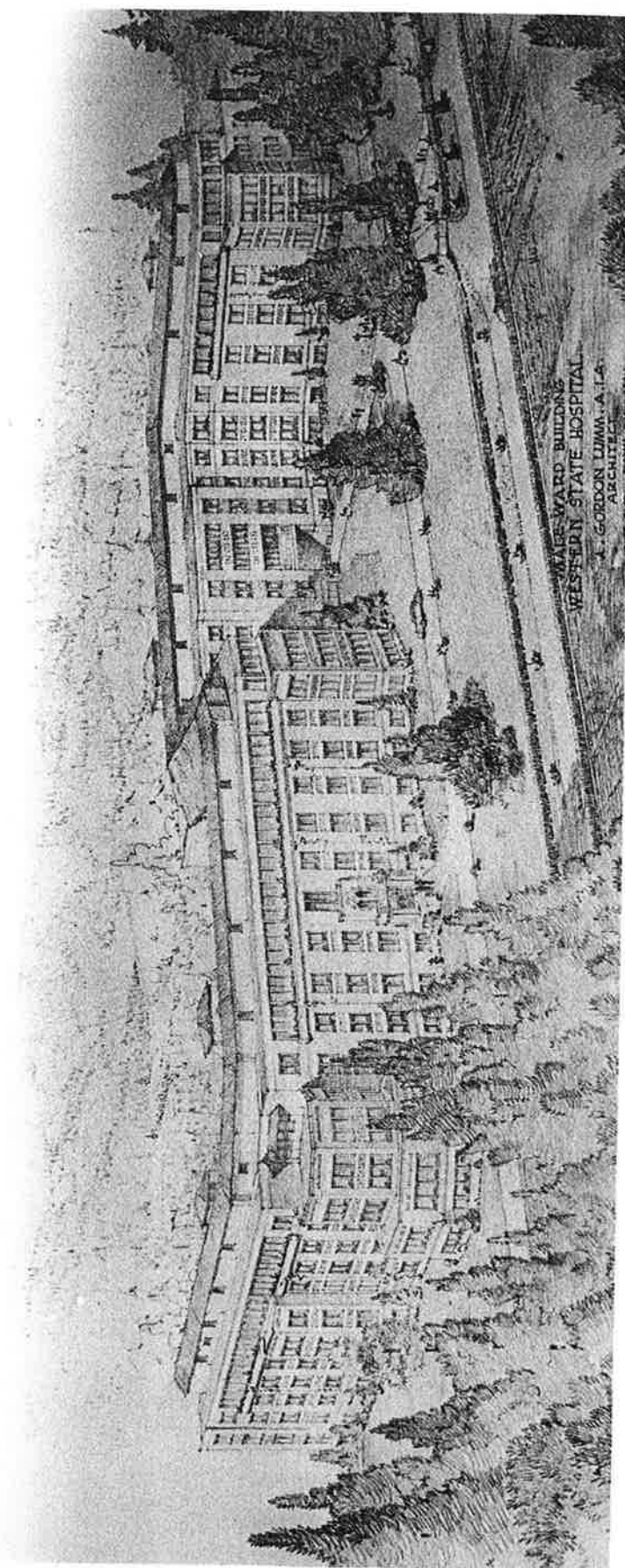




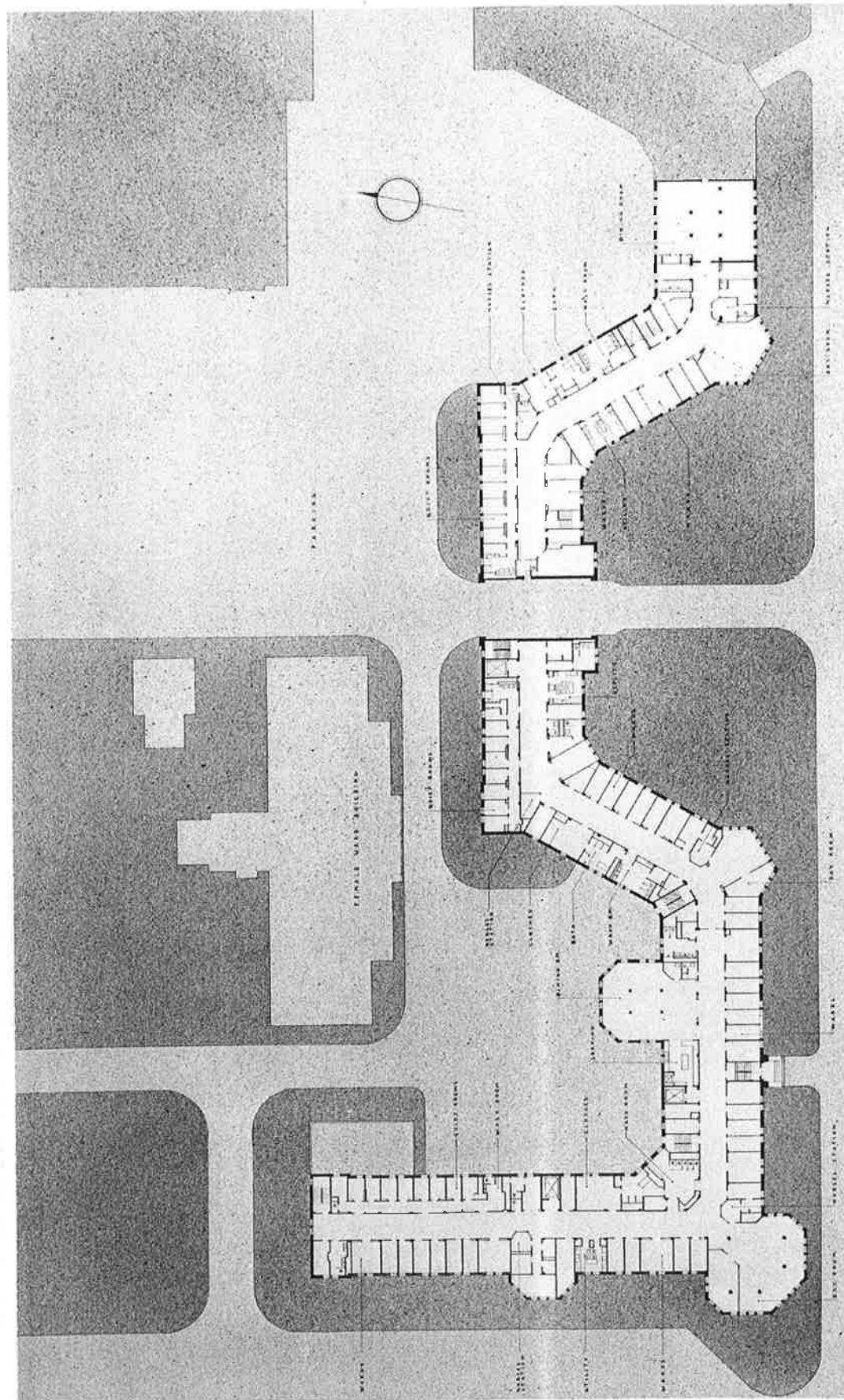








MALE WARD BUILDING

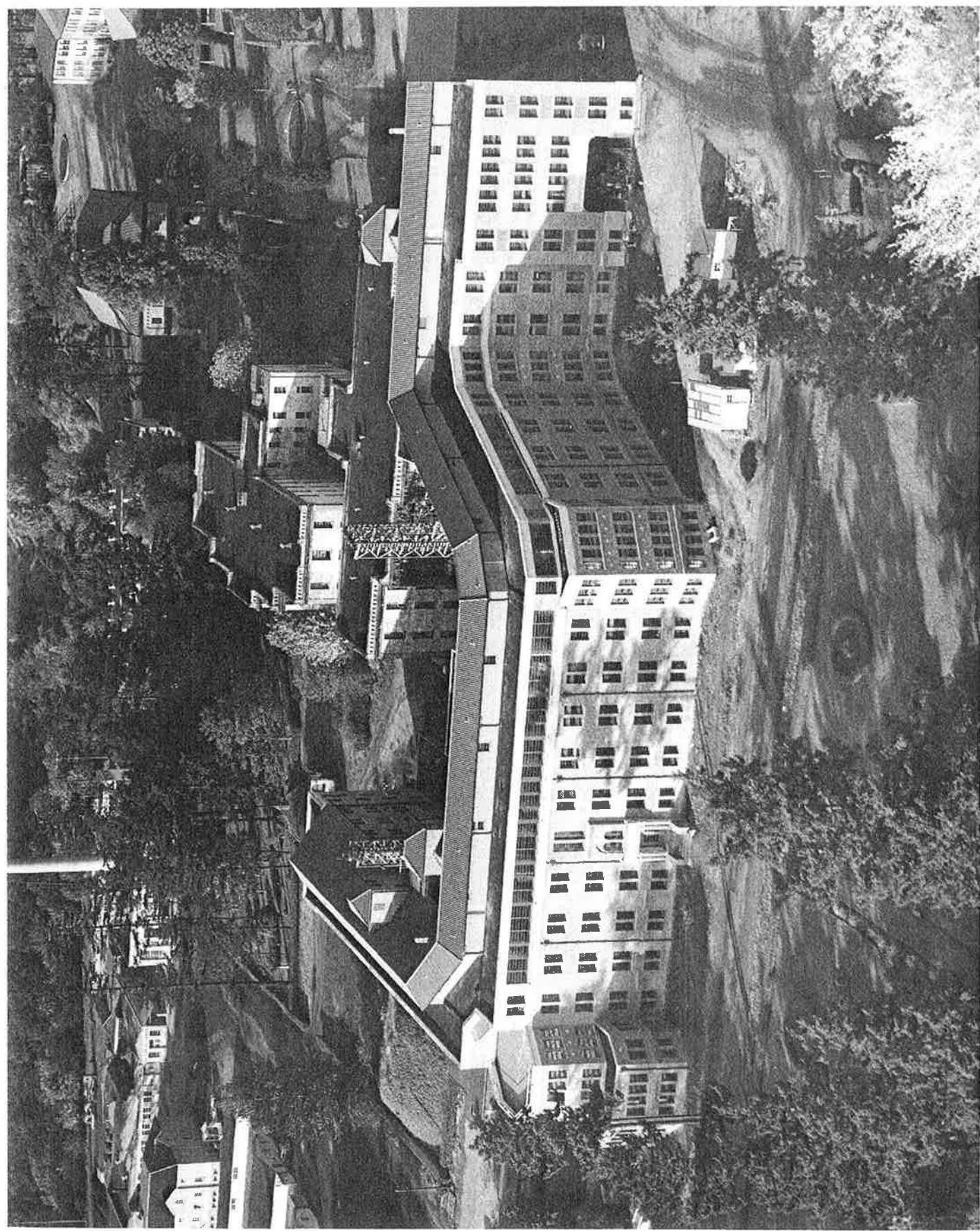


WESTERN STATE HOSPITAL

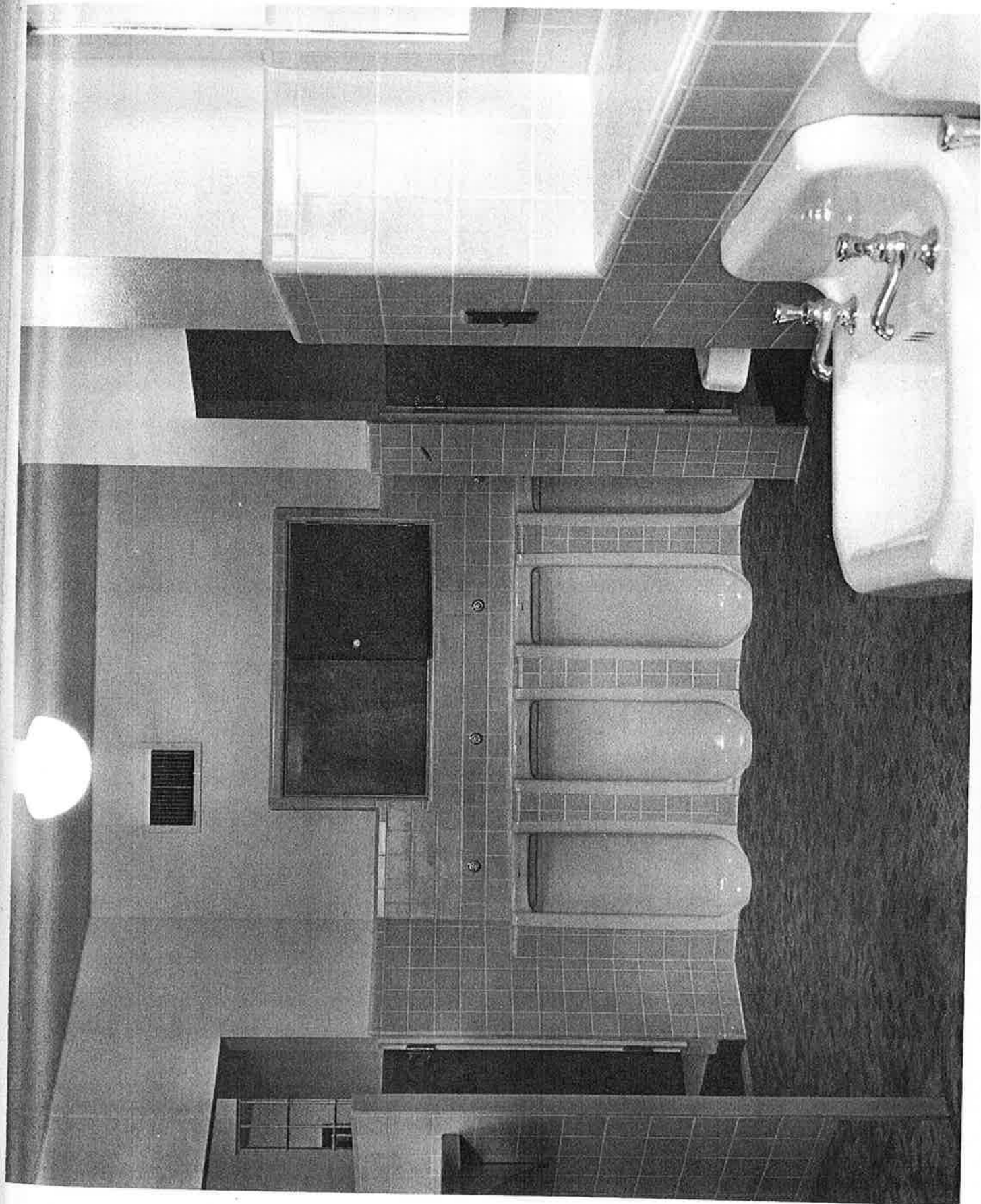






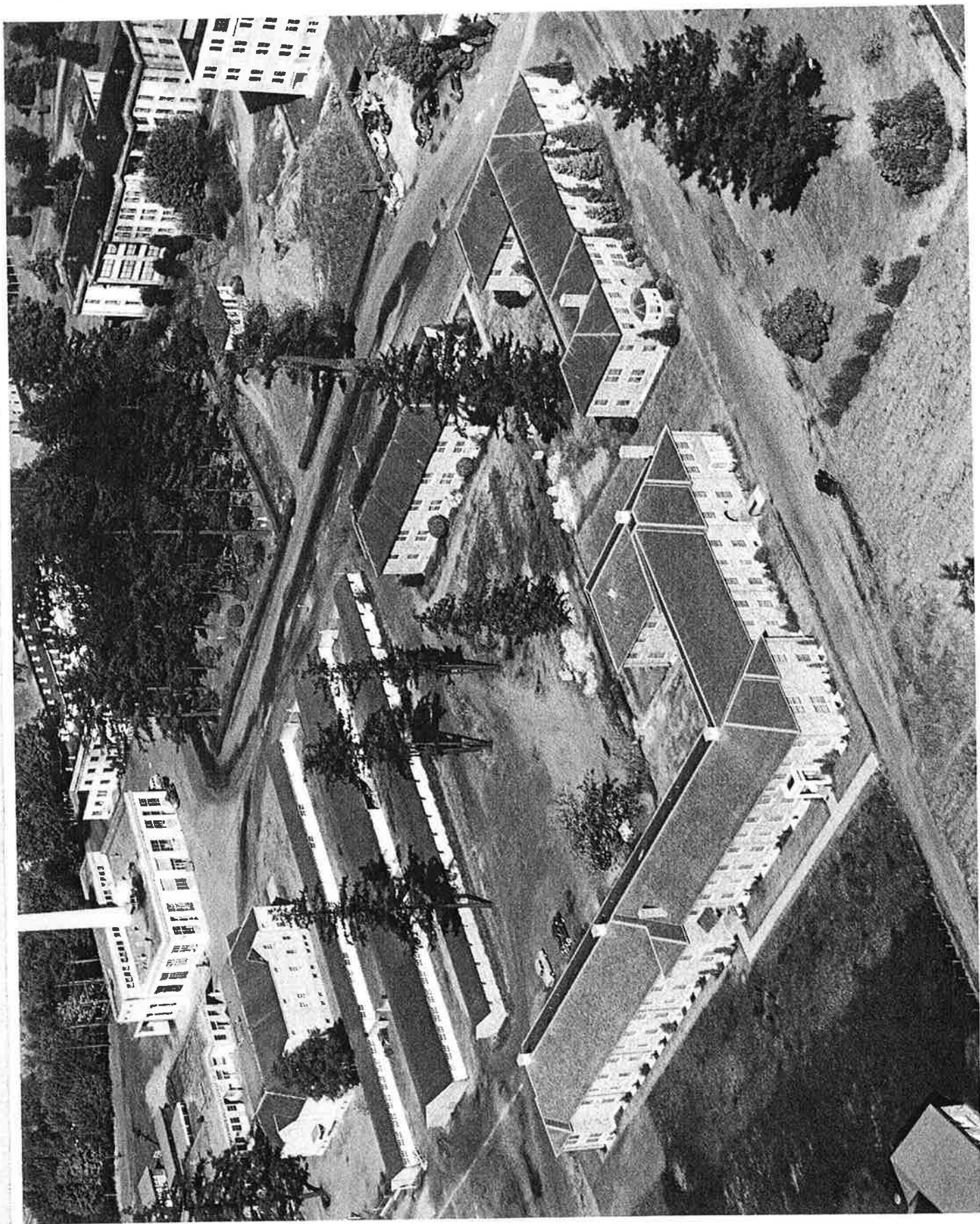


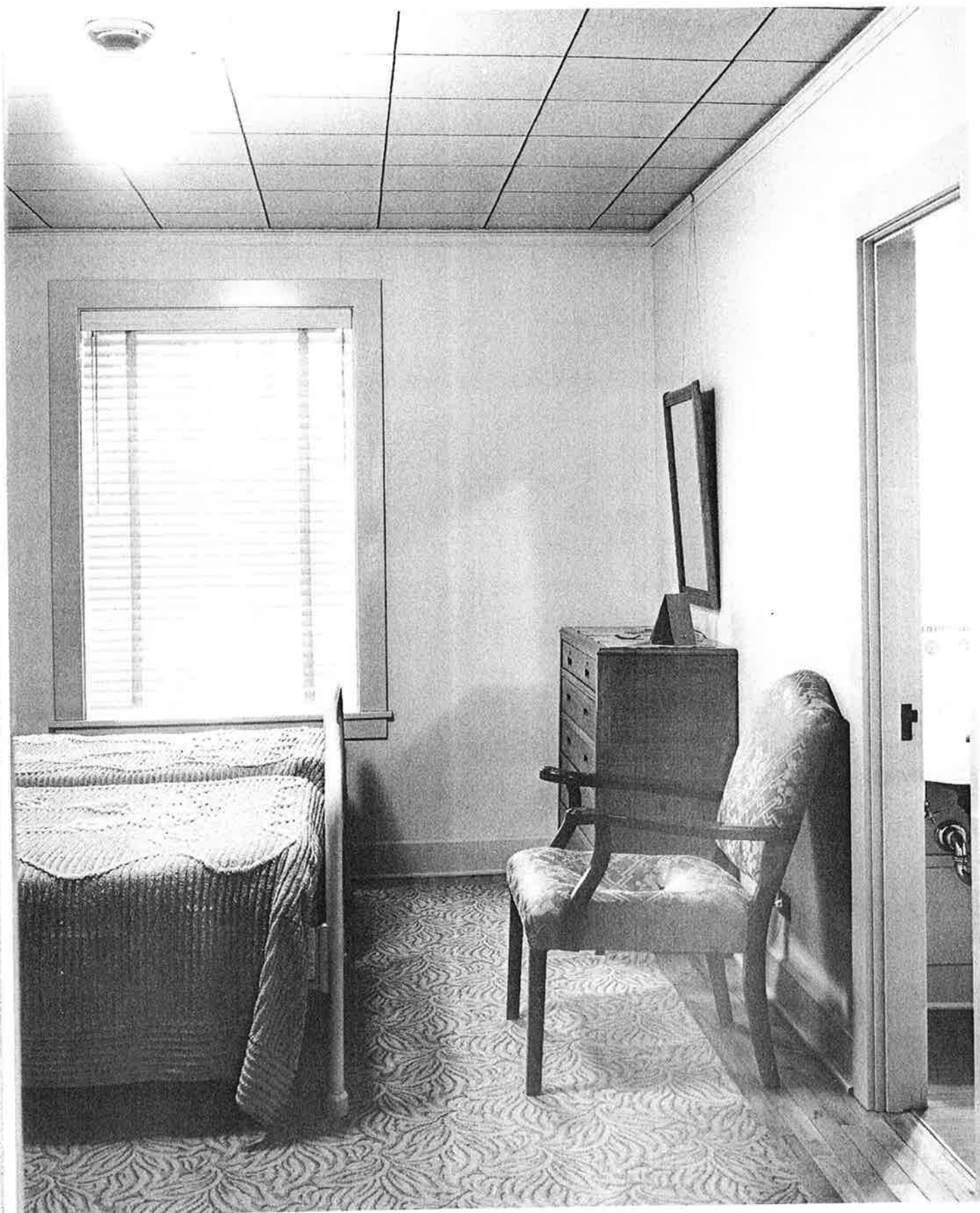












STREET MAP OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

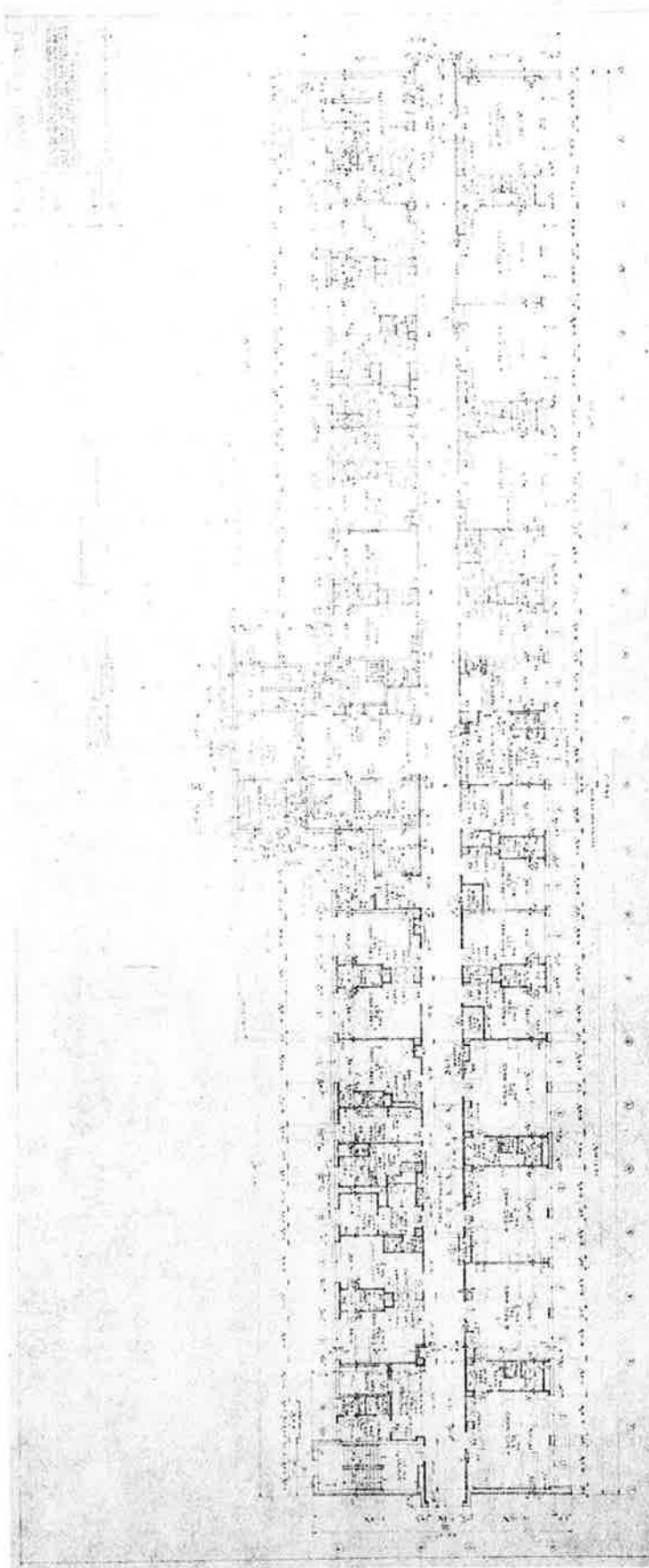

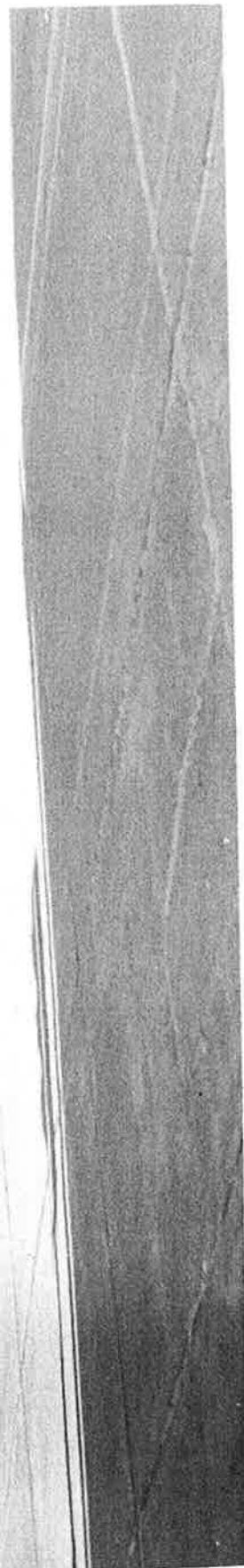


PLAN OF BUILDING FROM VIEW STATION ON PLATE

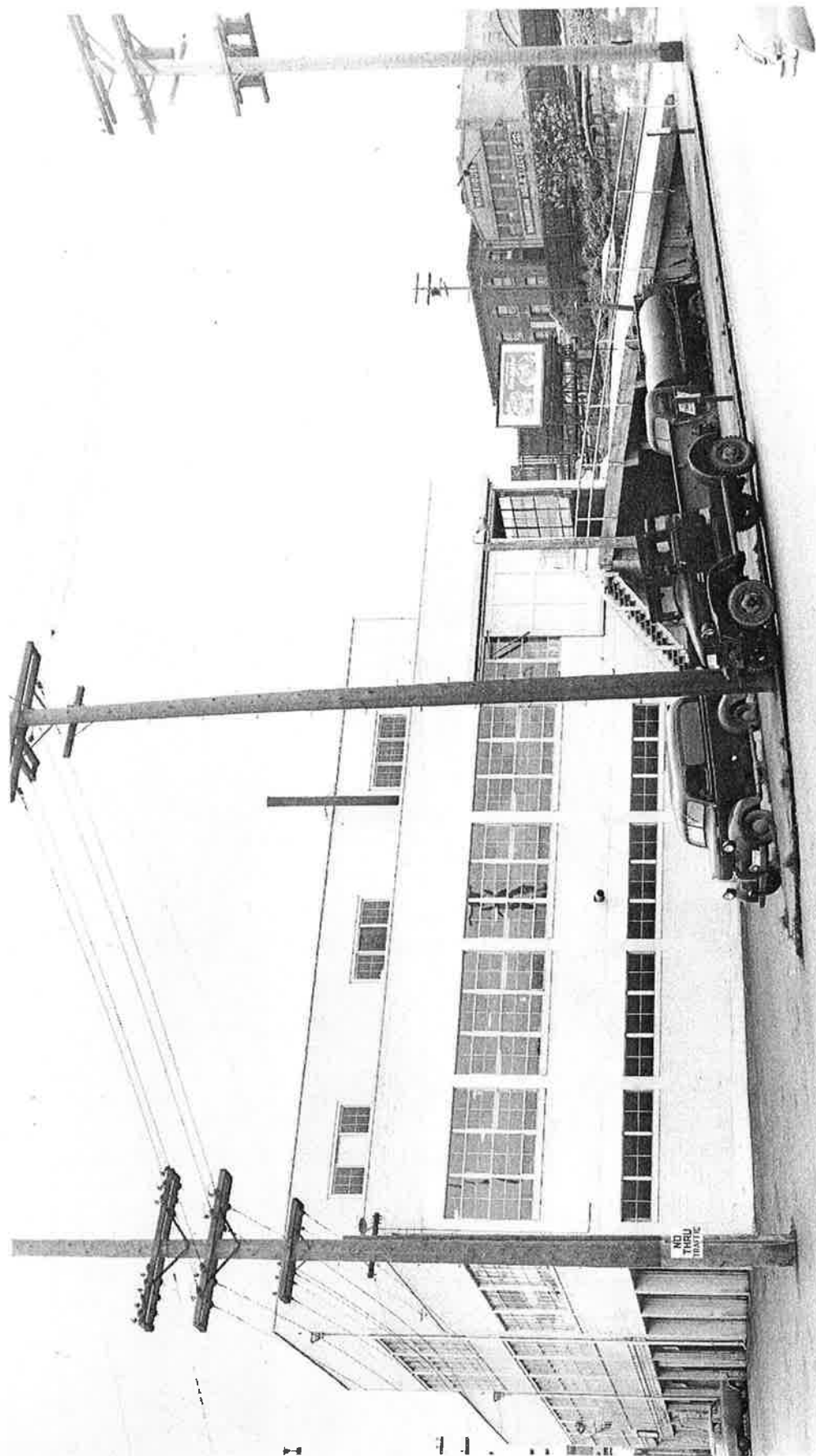


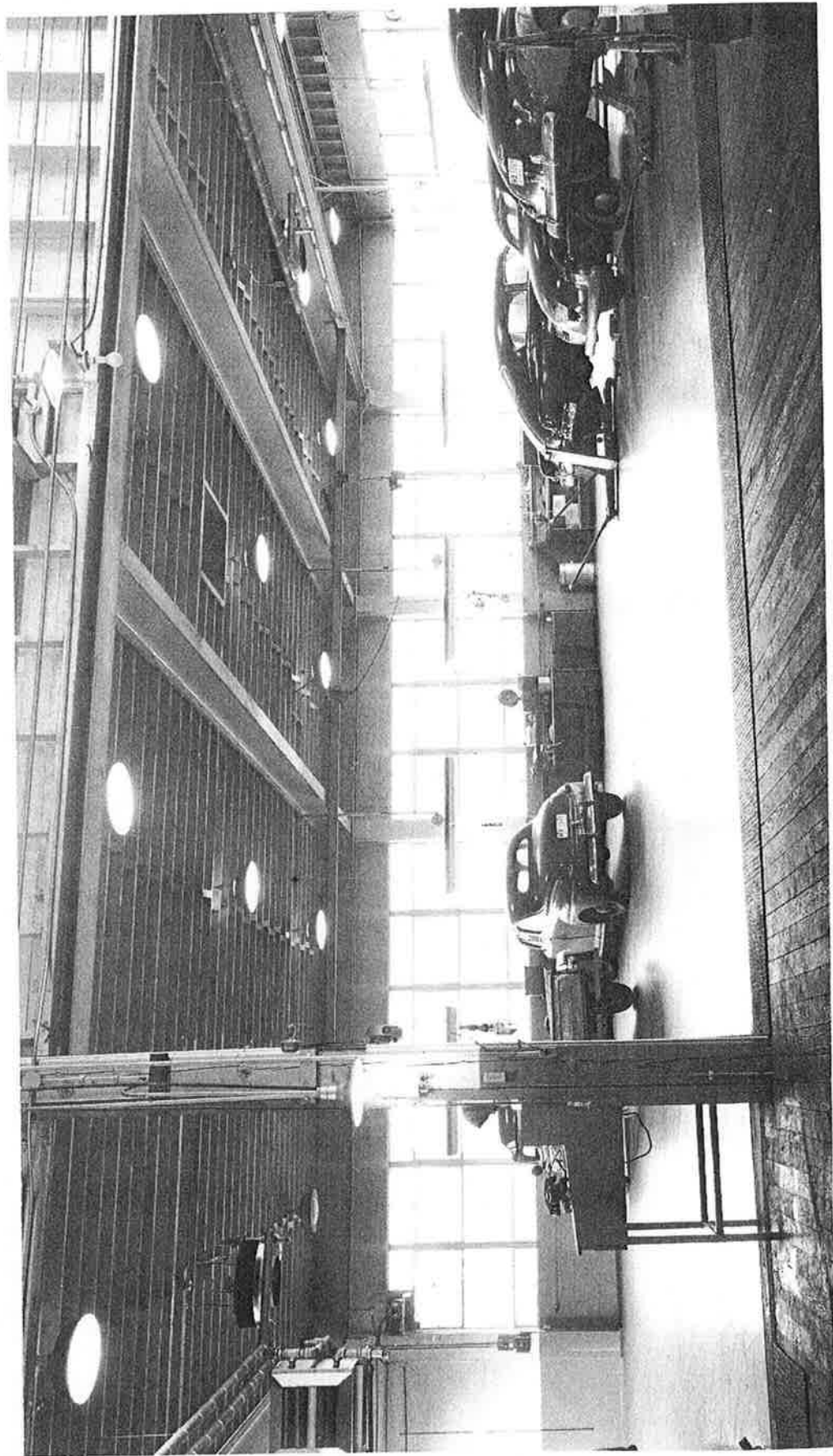
MOUNTAIN VIEW TUBERCULOSIS SANATORIUM

The Associated Oil Service Stations at 5525 Pacific Ave. was known as Charlie Walker's Associated Service Station in 1948 when this photo was taken. The station was built in 1934 for Emil Muscek. It was designed by A. Gordon Lumm following the architectural ideas present at the Century of Progress. The station closed in the late '60s.

LOOKING BACK

100 years ago today: Oct. 8, 1902

Contracts for a new transformer and a switch-board for the city lights have been let to a representative of General Electric, and a \$1,500 contract for a test well to be dug in South Tacoma has been renewed.

50 years ago today: Oct. 8, 1952

The price of milk will increase one-half a cent a quart at once. Quarts of milk at retail are now 22 cents in Tacoma, half-pints of whipping cream are 35 cents; pints of half and half are 29 cents.

25 years ago today: Oct. 8, 1977

Construction of the controversial, long-delayed Lakewood-Parkland sewer system was still scheduled to begin Monday as opponents lost yet another round in their legal battle against the \$72 million project.
