## Project Archaeologist - Full Time

Northern Land Use Research Alaska is seeking two Project Archaeologists to join our collaborative team of experts in Anchorage or Fairbanks, AK. This is a salaried, full time position with an anticipated salary of \$73,000-\$83,000 depending on experience and qualifications.

The Project Archaeologist performs project execution tasks through direct involvement with project management, background research, developing research and field method designs, completing field investigations, technical analyses, and report writing. This position involves providing logistical support, staff planning/scheduling, completing data collection, and technical writing. This role will fulfil field roles and may involve direct supervision of Field Directors, Crew Chiefs, and/or Archaeological Technicians.

Candidates should assume that up to 60% of their time will be spent in the field and in travel, and at least 30% of that travel will be outside of the office area and be for multiple days.

## Minimum qualification requirements:

- M.A./M.S. in Anthropology/Archaeology or closely related field.
- 3 years' field experience in CRM project environments with 2-3 years of increasing supervisory and project management experience.
- Completion of Archaeology field school OR demonstrated equivalent with archaeology survey and data collection methods.
- Preferred applicants will have 3 years' experience leading archaeological crews for Phase I (survey), II (testing), and/or III (mitigation) fieldwork in Alaska.
- Demonstrated technical and analytical report writing skills.
- Working knowledge of the federal, state, and local laws, regulations, standards and guidelines governing cultural resource management.
- Required skills include the ability to (1) carry up to 50lbs of equipment while walking an average of 3 consecutive miles a day across uneven terrain, (2) complete assigned tasks as part of a team, and (3) use verbal and written communication to listen and communicate effectively.
