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

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FOREWORD



HE publication of this book has for its purpose the placing in the hands of prospective builders, a suitable medium from which may be made the selection of plans and designs which will most accurately fulfill their needs.

When one has a home to build; when a district has a school to build; when a congregation has a church to build; or when a business man, company or corporation desires to erect a building, whether it be a bank, office building, hotel, apartment or factory building, each requires the most careful thought and study. Whatever the purpose of the building and whatever the cost, all are entitled to a proper return in value

for the dollars invested. Each building should be adapted to the individual requirements of the occupant or owner.

It is, of course, impossible to confine in one volume a variety of designs suitable to all individual needs and preferences, but we have endeavored in this publication to show a sufficient variety of designs from which, in most cases, a selection may be made.

In cases wherein no plan or design can be selected which will properly fulfill the requirements of the prospective builders, we are prepared to co-operate with them in designing whatever type of building may be desired. Under the heading of "Special Work" will be found full information regarding our special plans, as well as many helpful suggestions for the builder.

The imperative necessity of properly executed working plans and specifications for the proper construction of all buildings, whether large or small, is so well known that it requires no special emphasis here. Their absence oftentimes proves many times more costly to the owner than their original cost would have been.

SELECTION OF PLANS

In the selection of plans from the sketches given, if any additional information is desired concerning the various designs, we will be pleased to answer fully all inquiries.

Our charges for complete plans and specifications including, in all cases, all necessary full size and large scale details, are given in connection with the designs shown.

All stock plans should be ordered by the numbers given (both plan numbers and design numbers).

Remittance by money order, check or draft must accompany order in all cases.

EXTRA BLUE PRINTS AND SPECIFICATIONS, MATERIAL LIST AND BLANK CONRACTS

At a small extra charge additional blue prints and specifications, together with the necessary material list and blank contract, will be furnished. This charge is noted in connection with the designs as shown.

The material list will, in all cases, be found of the greatest convenience to the builder and owner, as it gives a complete schedule of all dimension lumber, siding, shingles, etc., necessary for the proper construction of the building. From this list estimates may be secured from the local mills and material dealers which will materially help in reducing the cost of construction of the building.

In cases where it is desired to have the building erected by contract, an additional set of blue prints and specifications, as well as a properly drawn and executed form of building contract are a necessity and their absence may prove a costly "economy" for the owner. The slight additional cost at which these may be secured is a profitable investment in most cases.

ESTIMATES

It is our aim, in all cases to make our estimates as accurate as possible and for this reason we have given the two figures, the average of which will in most cases be a close estimate of the ultimate cost. Where the cost of a heating plant is included we have so stated in the estimates.

The varying conditions and costs of material in different localities make it impossible for us to place an exact figure for the cost of any structure, but as a general rule local contractors will furnish estimates in accordance with the actual conditions under which the building is to be erected.

WHAT A SET OF OUR WORKING PLANS CONSIST OF

Basement, or foundation plans, roof and floor plans, four elevations, showing front, rear and two sides; all drawn to a 1/4-inch scale, with every dimension carefully figured and marked; a complete set of scale and full size details as required for everything on the exterior and interior of the building.

Our specifications are made complete in every detail and so worded as to give a clear and concise description or schedule of all workmanship and materials required. Full protection is given to the owner as well as fair treatment for the contractor.

SPECIAL WORK

As mentioned heretofore, in all cases where no suitable plan or design can be selected from among those shown, WE WILL DEVELOP YOUR PLANS FROM ROUGH SKETCHES.

In the back of this book will be found a specially prepared blank sheet, on which you will find it an easy matter to tell us fully your wants and to make a rough sketch giving us some idea of the general arrangement of floor plans desired.

From this information and sketch you send us, we will make a drawing with such improvements as our experience and judgment dictate and submit the same to you for final inspection.

Our charges for this service are as follows:

Sketch for any dwelling of five rooms or under (not including hallways, baths, etc.) \$5.00.

For larger houses add \$1.00 for each additional room over five rooms. Remittance for sketches must accompany order.

For schools and other buildings, a charge will be made for sketches of not less than \$10.00, and will be based upon the character and size of the work desired. Prices for these sketches will be sent upon application stating requirements.

CHARGES FOR SPECIAL PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS

Our charges for special work, including complete plans and specifications, blank contracts, etc., as a general rule, are based upon the estimated cost of the proposed building. This charge is two per cent of the estimated cost, except in special cases where the magnitude or special requirements of the work make necessary a greater charge. In all such cases we will quote you an exact figure covering our charges, which will be sent upon the return of sketches for approval.

There are many people who spend years in planning their home, and many more years in regretting that it is not right.

If any suggestions shown on the various plans and interiors given in this book are desired to be incorporated in the plans for special work, mention the same and refer to the designs by number.

If, upon receipt of our special sketches, any changes are desired, the same may be noted upon a separate sheet and returned with the sketches. If order for complete plans and specifications accompanies the return of sketches, where necessary on account of numerous changes, etc., we will redraw the same and forward for final approval without extra charge.

Our estimates of cost will accompany sketches in all cases.

When ordering special plans and specifications, please enclose one-half the price with order, as evidence of good faith, the remainder when plans are finished, which will be sent C. O. D. to the address directed. Express charges will be prepaid when full price of plans is sent with the order.

BUNGALOWS AND MODERN HOMES

Primarily the word "Bungalow" conveys to the mind the idea of a low, rambling, one-story dwelling, the exterior of which must be at once novel and attractive as well as simple and graceful in outline. The interior features must be designed for economy of space and utility and must typify "home comfort" to the highest degree. The arrangement must be such

as will make possible the saving of all unnecessary steps for the housewife. To use a well-worn phrase there must be "a place for everything." These features, together with the comparative low cost, are what have made the bungalow the most popular type of dwelling.

The incorporation of the features of the bungalow into larger homes of one and one-half and two stories, has made the term bungalow signify this type as well as the one-story dwelling. However, a distinction is always maintained from the older fashioned "cottage" with its steep roof, elaborate mill work and box-like rooms.

Among the larger bungalows, a type has arisen which has adapted many features from the Swiss, and which is popularly termed the "Swiss Chalet" or "Swiss" bungalow. The peculiar advantage of this style lies in its relatively low cost for a larger number of rooms. It is compact, covers little ground and has fewer breaks in outline.

The "Story-and-a-half" bungalow also has many advantages as it enables the placing of several rooms under the low roof thus utilizing the otherwise wasted attic space. The low sloping roof lines often add a pleasing touch to the exterior appearance that can be obtained in no other way.

The "Mission Style", as popularly termed, is often misapplied. It should typify simplicity, and the absence of applied ornament. The rough cast plaster exterior and the terra-cotta or metal roof tiles generally used, together with its simple arches and roof lines, lend to this type a pleasing and harmonious appearance.

THE EXTERIOR OF THE BUNGALOW

Rough or unsurfaced siding is most often used on the exterior walls of the bungalow, as when properly stained it is more in keeping with this style. Some very pleasing effects are also obtained by the use of shakes and shingles. Either rough or surfaced casings and trim may be used.

On the lower pitched roofs, such as are found on the "Swiss" type of bungalow, it is many times best to use, in place of the ordinary shingled roof, some onc of the prepared asbestos roofings. This material when properly applied, and laid with the white surface uppermost, reflecting as it does, the sun's rays, makes possible the low pitched roof without any undue warmth to the rooms below, as well as providing a secure and "tight to the weather" roof. Actual tests have proven the temperature in the attic and upper stories of dwellings roofed with white asbestos roofing to be much lower than can be obtained by the use of the usual shingled roof. The white surface also has a value in affording a pleasing contrast with the darker stained walls of the building.

In the treatment of porch piers of masoury, as well as the outer facing of chimneys and fireplaces, native stone will many times be found to be as appropriate a material as could be desired and often at a lower cost. Dark brick, interlocking facing tiles, stucco, rough cast plaster, and an endless variety of other materials may also be used with pleasing effect.

THE INTERIOR OF THE HOME

In the construction of the home certain features should require the most careful attention. Among the most important of these is the construction of all flues, chimneys and fireplaces. All flues should be lined with terra-cotta flue lining. Fireplaces should be constructed with proper sized flues to afford ample draught. Nothing can cause more regrets than a "smoky" fireplace.

In planning one-story dwellings, an inside stairway leading to the attic should be incorporated when space permits, as it affords a most convenient space for storage, as well as offering access to any rooms which may be later fitted up in the attic space. An inside stairway leading to the basement, and convenient of access from the kitchen is a necessity. Also, where possible a separate outside entrance to the basement should be provided. Wherever practicable our plans provide for these features.

The basement should in all cases be of ample size for the accommodation of the heating plant, fuel rooms, storage, and laundry rooms if desired. Our basement plans provide, in most cases, for a full basement and in no case for less space than will afford ample room for the above requirements. Where possible the basement floors should be of concrete and slope to a basement drain.

The laundry room, provided with the proper fixtures, may be placed in the basement, or if desired, in many cases the laundry trays may be installed on the "Screened Porch". Where this arrangement is made, sash and doors should be provided for the screened openings, for use during the colder weather.

Another feature that should receive consideration is the arrangement of the bath with regard to easy access from the various rooms. It should have but one door, thus securing privacy, and should be entered from a hallway opening to the bedrooms and other principal rooms, except in eases where the bath and bedrooms are desired en suite.

Screened sleeping balconies are deservedly popular in all climes and will add much to the comfort and healthfulness of the home. In many cases the screened openings may be equipped with movable sash, thus affording an additional sleeping room.

The arrangement of the kitchen should be such as to afford ample cupboard space, shelf and closet room. A cooling closet is a valuable feature, which will be found incorporated in many of our bungalow plans. Our kitchens are, in every instance, designed so as to require the fewest possible steps for the necessary household work. Flour bins and all other accessories are provided for.

In all bungalow designs shown in this book, the estimates include hardwood floors in the living room, dining room and other principal rooms.

The interior finishes for woodwork may be varied, both in accordance with the amount to be expended and the character of the rooms. Natural stained finishes, showing the grain of the various woods, are generally used in the living room

and other principal rooms, while for bedrooms and halls, either white enamel or oiled or varnish finishes may be used. For the kitchen and bath white enamel forms the most satisfactory finish, as it is easily kept clean. A plaster wainscotting finished in enamel, either marked as tile or left plain and to a height of from four to six feet, forms a very desirable finish for the walls of the bath and kitchen.

Treatment of the walls varies, of course, with the cost of the building. They may be kalsomined in suitable tints, or "washable wall finishes" used which also give a flat tone to the walls as well as being more sanitary than the ordinary kalsomine. The walls of the bath and kitchen may be painted if desired. Wall papers and hangings, while slightly more expensive, may well be used in producing the best effects in interior decoration. Pleasing effects may also be obtained with stenciled patterns.

The selection of the hardware is of vital importance, both as regards quality and material as well as design. It should be in harmony with the finish of the interior and great care used in its selection.

Heating for the building may be either by hot air furnace, steam or hot water heat. For the dwelling of ordinary size very satisfactory results may be obtained in any climate by the use of a hot air furnace, properly installed. However, in larger homes and other buildings, hot water or steam heating will be found more satisfactory.

CONSTRUCTION

The construction shown in all our plans and specifications is adapted to the colder as well as to the milder climates. It is thorough and so shown as to obtain the best results from the materials used.

SPECIAL DESIGNS FOR FURNITURE, ETC.

The furnishing of the home requires much consideration and should be in keeping with the interior design. Where desired we will furnish designs for special furniture properly adapted to the interior character of the home, and at a small charge. Upon application we will give price and estimates for any special designs desired.

LANDSCAPE WORK

On page 28 will be found sketch showing a typical landscape plat (reduced in size) showing plan of grounds and surroundings for a moderate priced home.

The surroundings and setting of the home determine in a great measure its value and merit, both from an artistic and financial point of view. Improper grounds may ruin the appearance of an otherwise artistic building, while even the simplest of landscape treatment, properly designed, cannot fail to add immensely to the value of any residence.

We will prepare landscape drawings as shown in the sketch for a charge of \$10.00. For more extensive work special

estimates will be quoted upon application. Orders for this work should be accompanied by a sketch showing the location and outside dimensions of the buildings (if already erected), also general plan or surveyor's contour plat of the grounds, and all general information.

SCHOOLS

The matter of public schools is of such importance that it should have the greatest of care. When children are fitting themselves for the coming years they should be surrounded by conditions which will induce them to give their studies their best efforts. When school rooms are overheated, good work cannot be accomplished, and when poorly or inadequately heated, the conditions are even worse and the health of the pupils, the most vital requisite of good work is endangered. With improper ventilation, all the evils arising from the lack of, or excess of heating are present. However, of fully as great importance, is the proper lighting of the school room, for no matter how perfect are all other conditions, a high standard of work cannot be maintained in the absence of the proper arrangement of the windows for admitting light so that all parts of the room have sufficient light from the proper direction and with no shadows or unnatural glare.





Design Number 104 B


A very typical Spanish design suitable to any climate. The exterior is of stucco on metal lath and the construction of frame. Brick may be used for the exterior walls if desired and either metal or terra cotta roof tiles. The floor plans show the open court or patio which is one of the attractive features of this design. There is a large open balcony over the main veranda and porte-cochere. The three fireplaces are of brick in attractive design. The open stairway from the reception hall is one of the most pleasing features of this plan. The large and finely appointed bath is also worthy of mention. The balcony in the tower may be screened for use as an outside sleeping room, or may be fitted with sash, making an extra bedroom. Hardwood floors are used in all principal rooms. Estimates given are for frame construction:


