- Basic knowledge of Pacific Northwest site/artifact types, field methods and soils.
- Ability to manage work time efficiently and complete projects on time and within scope and budget.
- Must follow a detailed monitoring plan and potentially work with tribal representatives,
- Must have a history of good work attendance and punctuality and have reliable transportation.
- Knowledge of Microsoft Suite is preferred.

Job Specific Information

Work will take place in central Washington State, beginning in March or April, 2021. Work will consist of cultural resources survey and/or monitoring excavation in central Washington State. The job involves recording/updating cultural resources, completing daily logs, and working with City and Construction company personnel. Hotel for four night a week is included on monitoring projects, and per diem is \$66/day. Pay rate would depend on experience \$2-\$30 per hour.
