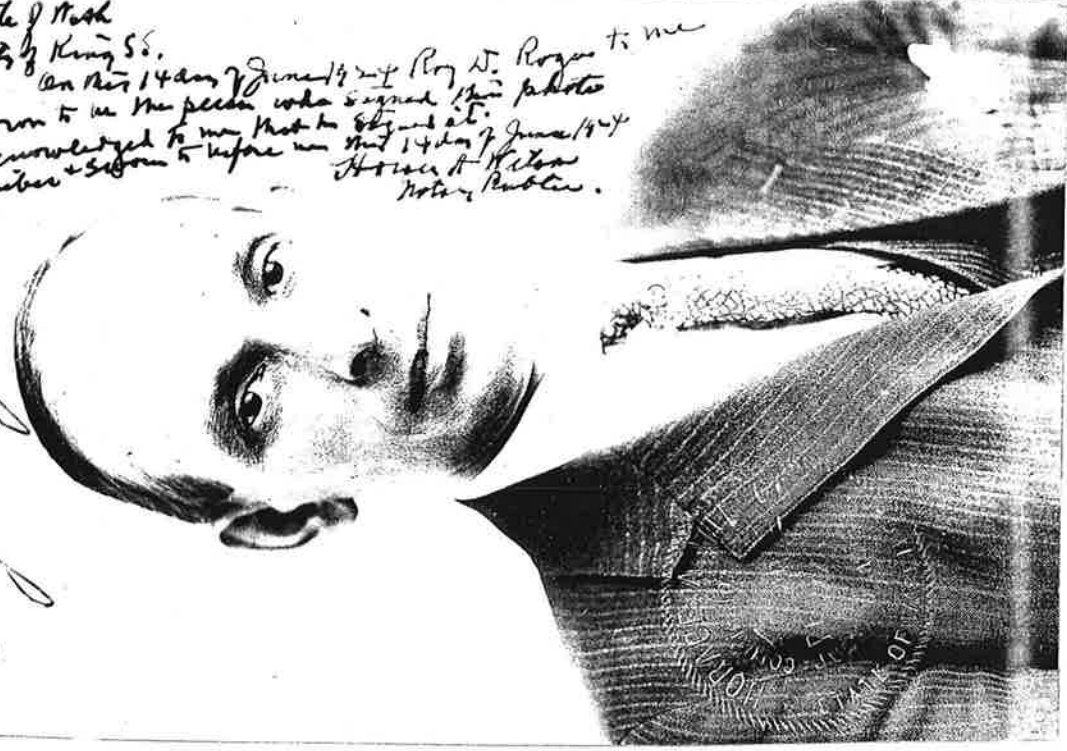

Gentlemen:


Mr. Roy D. Rogers, a resident of this city, a number of years ago planned and acted as Supervisory Architect on my home at 1005 Queen Anne Avenue.

The general design has been copied a number of times in this city and State and even today is being visited by Architects and by home-builders on account of its many pleasing features and beauty. This is a modest home and has at all times been one that would sell for much more than it cost, -this on account of the superb architecture and quality of workmanship and material which Mr. Rogers, to my personal knowledge, exacted of the Contractor.

The strong point, in my judgment, in Mr. Roger's architectural work is the fact that he combines very unusual artistic ability with a fine knowledge of those things which are of value in the use of a home and a knowledge as to construction, in my opinion, seldom equalled in an architect.

This home was built without the slightest friction and was turned over complete, and there has never been a single change which we have found desirable to make since the keys were turned over.
