

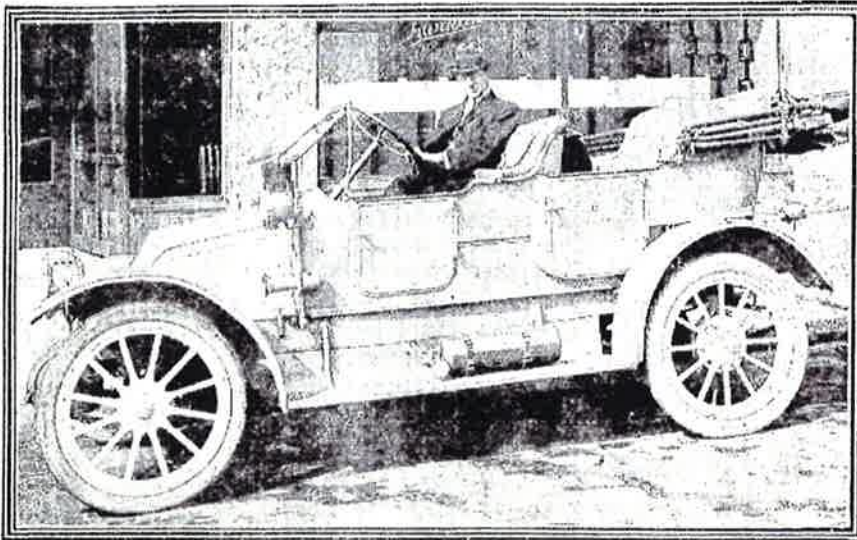

# SEATTLE ARCHITECT OBTAINS REMARKABLE FUEL RECORD IN OLD FRANKLIN MODEL MADE IN 1911

Many records have been reported by Franklin owners of new series cars, but even more interesting if possible was that told by Fred B. Stephen, Seattle architect, who made it in his 1911 Model G. After it had run 15,000 miles, the car made twenty-three miles to the gallon over Snoqualmie Pass and return, a distance of 156 miles, and went from Seattle to Portland with full load on nine gallons.

Seattle alumni of the University of Pennsylvania at their monthly meeting at the Northold Inn yesterday noon nominated Dr. Park Weed Willis to represent this district at the committee of 100 alumni who are selected from various sections of the country to confer with the trustees on the selection of a new president to succeed Dr. Edgar V. S. Smith, present head of the University of Pennsylvania, who retires in June.

### Hears Demurrer Arguments.

Arguments on demurrers to grand jury indictments against C. D. McConaghy, real estate dealer, with offices in the American Bank Building, and his wife, Mrs. Delphia McConaghy, charging unlawful alteration of War Savings Certificates, were taken under advisement by Federal Judge Jeremiah Neterer late yesterday. Contentions of counsel is that no offense against the United States has been committed by McConaghy and his wife in their dealings in stamps and certificates. Indictments were based on investigations made by secret service operatives.
