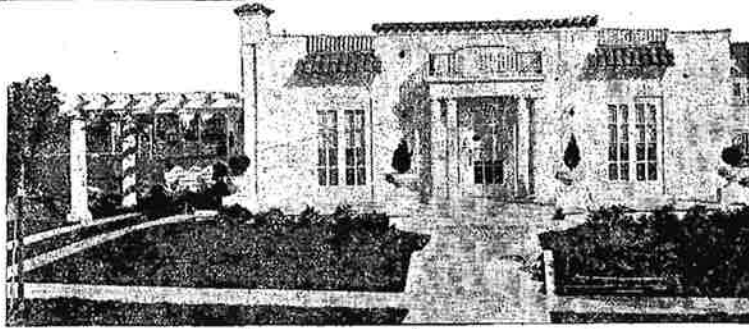

House Should Be Planned to Meet Requirements and Ideals, and It Will Please.

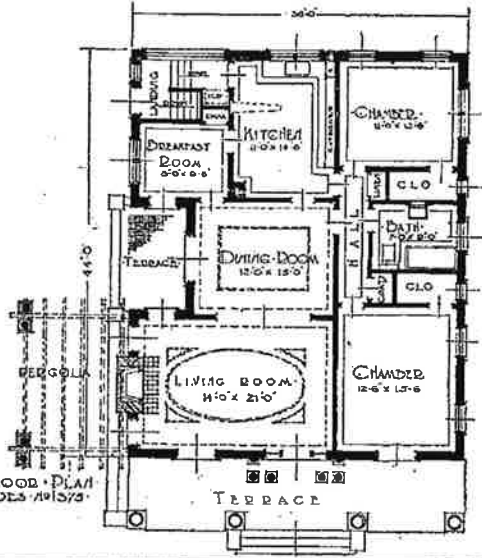
AFFORDS A SAVING PLAN

There is nothing which so strongly reflects the personality of a family as the home in which they live, declare architects and others who have made an extensive study of domestic architecture. It is said that the building often has a direct influence on the health and morals of its occupants. Individuality can be strongly reflected by persons planning or about to build their own home. It is a mistaken idea that a house must necessarily have a bay window or a side porch just because this happens to be a prevailing style in a neighborhood or community. Neither is it essential that the home have beamed ceilings, or French doors, or a porte cochere and a formal entrance, if something else pleases the builder better.

Builders advise that a house planned to meet the ideals and requirements of the intending occupant is always the best house. This does not necessarily mean a big house or an expensively built house, but one that is practical and fits in well with the environment. There are so many styles and adaptations of styles in domestic architecture that home builders are often nonplused, but it is pointed out, if the simple laws of requirement and simplicity are rather carefully observed, many difficulties will be overcome and the home will be a thing of beauty and a joy forever.

Home Owner Has Advantage.
In its campaign for more homes, the government has repeatedly pointed out that the family owning a comfortable, attractive home has twice the standing in the community as one that merely rents. A property owner, it is emphasized, also has much greater eligibility for public office and for positions of honor and trust. Business positions, it is said, are two to one in favor of the man who owns his own home.

Statistics also have been collected in the "Own Your Home" drive showing that many family incomes are never able to save anything until they contract to purchase a home. After a few years they find that their rent money has enabled them to purchase and pay for a home, which forever remains a source of an emergency loan and an asset of physical and moral value to every member of the household.
