# Wellsley Gwinn Funeral to Be Monday at 1

Funeral services for Wellsley Gwinn, 84, former chairman of the board of trustees of Seattle Pacific College, will be at 1 o'clock Monday in the First Nazarene Church. Burial will be in Washelli.

Mr. Gwinn, of 2401 N. W. 100th St., died yesterday in a Seattle hospital.

Mr. Gwinn was born in Nova Scotia. He had lived in Seattle 60 years. He was a retired building contractor and a member of the First Nazarene Church.

Mr. Gwinn was a member of the college's board from 1917 to 1946 and its chairman from 1934 to 1946.
