Presently the Confederated Tribes of the Colville Reservation (Colville Confederated Tribes [CCT]) History/Archaeology Program is advertising an Archaeologist I position. This position is seasonal and based on federal funding sources. In some cases, seasonal positions will lead to fulltime year-round work.

Cost of living differences between the Grand Coulee Dam/Omak area and more urban areas, such as Seattle and Portland, can be significant. For example, the cost of house is 280% higher in Seattle over Grand Coulee and Portland is 99% more expensive than Omak. Please see attached sheet that gives cost of living comparisons. Nonetheless, the CCT offers wages and benefits that are competitive with those found in metropolitan areas.
